First Reading ~ Malachi 3:10-12

Bring the entire tithe, the whole tenth of your bounty, into the storehouse that there may be food in my house! Prove me now in this, says YHWH, and see if I do not open the windows of heaven and pour so much blessing out on you that you cannot contain it! I will keep pests from destroying the produce of your soil, and your vine in the field shall not be barren, says YHWH. All people will call you happy and blessed, for yours will be a delightful land.

Second Reading ~ Luke 6:37-38

Be compassionate, as your loving God is compassionate. Don't judge, and you won't be judged. Don't condemn, and you won't be condemned. Pardon, and you'll be pardoned. Give, and it will be given unto you: a full measure – packed down, shaken together, and running over – will be poured into your lap. For the amount you measure out is the amount you'll be given back."

Jesus sat down opposite the collection box and watched the people putting money in it, and many of the rich put in a great deal. A poor widow came and put in two small coins, the equivalent of a penny. Then Jesus called the disciples and said to them, "The truth is, this woman has put in more than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have put in money from their abundance, but she has put in everything she possessed from the little she had — all she had to live on."

People seem willing to look all over the place for their treasure. They will travel halfway around the world to visit a monastery in India. The last place most people look is right under their feet, in the everyday activities, accidents, and encounters of their lives. What possible spiritual significance could a trip to the grocery store have? How could something as common as a stranger asking for directions be a doorway to a greater life? No one longs for what they already have, and yet the accumulated insight of those wise about the spiritual life suggests that the reason so many of us cannot see the red X that marks the spot is because we are standing on it. The treasure we seek requires no lengthy expedition, no expensive equipment, no superior aptitude. All we lack is the consent to be where we are, and the willingness to realize that we already have everything we need.
