First Reading ~ *James 3:13-4:3, 7-8a*

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. The wisdom from above, however, has purity as its essence; peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. Peacemakers, when they work for peace, sow the seeds which will bear fruit in holiness.

Where do these conflicts and battles among you start? Isn't it that they come from the desires at war within you? You want something but don't get it, so you're prepared to kill to get it. You have ambitions that you can't satisfy, so you fight to get your way by force. The reason that you don't have what you want is that you don't ask for it in prayer. And when you do ask and don't get it, it's because you haven't prayed properly. You have prayed in order to indulge and satisfy yourself.

Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil and it will flee from you. Draw near to God, and God will draw near to you.

Second Reading ~ *adapted from Paula Gunn Allen*

Tribal people say words are sacred. We don't mean that you are supposed to kneel down and worship them. We mean that you should recognize that when you speak, your utterance has consequences, inwardly and outwardly, and that you are accountable for those consequences. You can't just say anything that comes into your head and then get distressed if another person acts on it. Of course, that other person may have misunderstood you, which means that they have a responsibility to find out exactly what you meant before they act, but the principle is still there. Without linguistic honor there can be no community, there can be no ethic, there can be no love, there can be no creative vision, there can be no peace, and there can be no relationship.
