God remembered Noah and all the wild animals and all the domestic animals that were in the ark, and sent a mighty wind over all the earth so that the waters began to subside. The springs of the Deep and the windows of the heavens were closed up. The rain from the heavens stopped. The water covering the earth gradually dropped, until at the end of 150 days, it was gone. In the seventh month, on the seventeenth day of the month, the ark came to rest on the mountains of Ararat. The waters continued to go down until the tenth month. This is wonderful news. I do not have to choose between the Sermon on the Mount and the magnolia trees. God can come to me by a still pool on the big island of Hawaii as well as at the altar of the Washington National Cathedral. The House of God stretches from one corner of the universe to the other. Sea monsters and ostriches live in it, along with people who pray in languages I do not speak, whose names I will never know.

I am not in charge of this House, our Home, and never will be. I have no say about who is in and who is out. I do not get to make the rules. Like Job, I was nowhere when God laid the foundations of the earth. I cannot bind the chains of the Pleiades or loose the cords of Orion. In biblical terms, it is compassion, empathy, and wisdom we need to live together in this world.
