First Reading ~ Luke 18:9-14

Jesus spoke this parable addressed to those who believed in their own self-righteousness while holding everyone else in contempt:

“Two people went up to the Temple to pray; one was a Pharisee, the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing on their own, prayed like this: ‘I give you thanks, O God, that I’m not like the others— greedy, crooked, adulterous —or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week. I pay tithes on everything I earn.’ The tax collector, however, standing far off, did not even dare to look up to heaven. In real humility, beating their chest, all the tax collector said was, ‘God, be merciful to me, a sinner.’”

“I tell you,” Jesus said, “the tax collector went home from the Temple justified, right with God, while the other didn’t. For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, while those who humble themselves will be exalted.”
