First Reading ~ Genesis 22:1-14

After these things God tested Abraham. He said to him, 'Abraham!' And he said, 'Here I am.' He said, 'Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains that I shall show you.' So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled a donkey, and took two workers with him, and his son Isaac. Abraham chopped wood for the burnt offering, and started on the journey to the place God showed them. On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place in the distance.
