First Reading ~ Luke 22:7-13

When the day of the Feast of the Unleavened Bread arrived, when the Passover lamb was to be sacrificed, Jesus sent Peter and John out with the instructions, "Go and make the preparations for us to eat the Passover." They asked, "Where do you want us to prepare the Seder?" Jesus answered, "When you enter the city, you will encounter a man carrying a jar of water. Follow him into the house he enters. Say to the owner of the house, 'The Rabbi asks, "Where is the guestroom where I can eat the Passover Seder with my disciples?" The owner will show you a larger furnished upper room. Make the preparations there." They went out and found everything as Jesus had told them. And they prepared the Passover.

On Oct. 6, 1968, Troy D. Perry, a young, gay, defrocked Pentecostal minister, held a worship service in his living room. 12 people showed up. The coffee table became the communion table and altar. An album of the Mormon Tabernacle Choir provided the service music. Lesbian, Gay, and straight, male and female, Trans and Gender-Queer, Christian and Jew were some of the labels of the people in the room. More than 9 months before Stonewall, this worship experience meant to welcome and affirm and celebrate LGBTQ people (known by various terms over the years) began a religious movement known as Metropolitan Community Churches.

Whatever becomes of MCC, the world will always be better because Troy Perry started a movement that said the LGBTQ members of the human family were part of the divine diversity of creation, and were fully embraced and loved by God; and that movement helped change hearts and minds and bring hope and healing to countless lives. MCC blessed our unions, performed our funerals, visited us in hospitals, debated the fundamentalists, spoke to city councils and state legislatures, and prepared and ordained ministers for ministry. Over 50 years ago, a prophet was raised up, and spoke the word of God's all-inclusive and unconditional love, and the Church and the world would never be the same again.
