Now in its 46th year, the San Antonio Breast Cancer Symposium (SABCS) took place from December 5-9, 2023. The event attracted 10,874 registered participants from 102 countries, all coming together to gain insights into the most recent advancements in breast cancer research, diagnosis, surgical procedures, radiation therapy, and patient care. The symposium also addressed survivorship, fertility, pregnancy, and quality of life.
