October 4, 2020, Ottawa citizen, Perth doctor says he was told to expect less flu vaccine in this the year of covid-19

Dr. Alan Drummond, an emergency and family medicine doctor in Perth, said his clinic received a memo from the province saying, essentially: "Whatever you asked for, you are going to get less," at least initially. Dr. Vera Etches, during a recent board of health meeting, said in a typical year 40 per cent of Ottawa residents are immunized against the flu. She said the target this year is for 70 per cent immunization.

Another Ottawa primary physician said she and her colleagues at the Riverside Court Medical Clinic are planning to hold a large drive-through flu vaccine clinic in the parking lot of the Met church on Prince of Wales Drive. But **Dr. Nicole Shadbolt** said she has been warned there are no

guarantees about how many vaccines she will get. Ottawa Public Health is in charge of distributing much of the flu vaccine used in Ottawa.
