Outdoor Gatherings Up to 250 Persons to be Permitted Under New Health Orders

May 27, 2020

Governor Mark Gordon has announced that updated public health orders effective June 1 will ease restrictions on public gatherings, allowing outdoor gatherings of up to 250 people. The updated orders allow for outdoor events to occur with social distancing and increased sanitization measures in place. Sporting events, rodeos and other events will be permitted to have up to 250 spectators in attendance, in addition to the event participants.

"It's time we had the chance to enjoy summer," Governor Gordon said. "The ability to gather outdoors in larger groups will be good for Wyoming citizens, businesses and our communities as we enter the season. We are not out of the woods yet though, so please use good judgement and don't jeopardize yourself and others by acting recklessly. We want to keep moving forward."

Hosts and organizers of these outdoor events are asked to screen staff for symptoms of COVID-19 and ensure adequate personal protective equipment is available. Food and beverage services at outdoor gatherings are required to follow the provision for restaurants outlined in Public Health Order No. 1. Indoor events and gatherings, other than religious gatherings and other exemptions listed in the order, will continue to be restricted to groups of 25 or fewer. No significant changes are being made to the updated Public Health Orders 1 and 3.

CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19) INFORMATION

SCHOOLS AND DAY CAMPS

CDC published recommendations for [Schools and Day Camps](#) to help keep communities safe while they resume peer-to-peer learning and to help provide support for parents and guardians as they return. These recommendations lay out a series of three steps to inform a gradual scale up of operations.

Step 1: Schools that are currently closed, remain closed. Restrict camps to children of essential workers and children who live in the local geographic area only.

- Provide e-learning or distance learning opportunities for all students.
- Provide student services such as school meal programs, as feasible.

Step 2: Schools open with enhanced social distancing measures and for children who live in the local geographic area only.

Step 3: Remain open with distancing measures.

- Restrict attendance to those from areas with limited transmission areas (other Step 3 areas) only.

Throughout this process, schools and day camps should:

- Establish and maintain communication with local and state authorities to determine current mitigation levels in the community.
- Protect and support staff and students who are at higher risk for severe illness by providing options such as telework and virtual learning.
- Follow CDC's Guidance for [Schools and Childcare Programs](#).
- Provide teachers and staff from areas with higher transmission telework and other options as feasible to eliminate travel to schools and camps in areas with lower transmission.

CHILDCARE PROGRAMS

[Childcare Programs](#) provides recommendations for the gradual scale up of activities at childcare programs towards pre-COVID-19 operating practices. Supporting childcare programs as they work to reopen safely also helps parents and guardians who cannot return to work without available childcare. This interim guidance lays out a series of three steps to inform a gradual scale up of operations.

Step 1: Restrict childcare programs to children of essential workers.

Step 2: Expand to all children with enhanced social distancing measures.

Step 3: Remain open for all children with social distancing measures.

Throughout this process, childcare programs should:

- Establish and maintain communication with local and state authorities to determine current mitigation levels in your community.
- Protect and support staff, children, and their family members who are at higher risk for severe illness.
- Provide staff from areas with higher transmission telework and other options as feasible to eliminate travel to childcare programs in areas of lower transmission and vice versa.
- Follow CDC's supplemental [Guidance for Childcare Programs that Remain Open](#).
- Encourage any other community groups or organizations that use the childcare facilities also to follow this guidance.

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AND WELLNESS

KEEP CHILDREN HEALTHY

Teach and reinforce everyday preventive actions

- Parents and caretakers play an important role in teaching children to wash their hands. Explain that hand washing can keep them healthy and stop the virus from spreading to others.
- Be a good role model—if you wash your hands often, they're more likely to do the same.
- Make handwashing a family activity.
- Learn more about what you can do to protect children.

Help your child stay active

- Encourage your child to play outdoors—it's great for physical and mental health.
- Take a walk with your child or go on a bike ride.
- Use indoor activity breaks (like stretch breaks or dance breaks) throughout the day to help your child stay healthy and focused.

Help your child stay socially connected

- Reach out to friends and family via phone or video chats.
- Write cards or letters to family members they may not be able to visit.
