



UKRAINE NEEDS YOUR HELP

Today, injured Ukrainian civilians and military on the battlefield lack access to basic life-saving medicine.



This morning, Ukrainians woke up to Russian attacks after weeks of fighting for their country. They are wounded, and their supply of everyday lifesaving drugs is dwindling. Soon, their wounds will develop into devastating infections. The Ministry of Health of Ukraine asked American Duty to procure and deliver non-narcotic pharmaceuticals to the battlefield to solve this problem.

American Duty is seeking the assistance of America's pharmaceutical industry to supply pro-bono shipments of the following drugs and fund logistics to the Ukraine-Polish border:

- Antibiotics
- Chronic Daily Medications
- Life Saving Medicines such as Insulin or Epi-pens
- Amoxicillin-Clavulanate

We are already working with The Ministry of Health of Ukraine to deliver free telemedicine solutions throughout the country during combat operations. Aimee is a telemedicine delivery platform connecting Ukrainian patients and practitioners to 2000+ U.S.-based physicians on-demand via a secure web-based video link.

American Duty's partners include VSee, Dr. Laura Purdy, and Red Element. VSee provides telemedicine to three continents, the International Space Station and Ukraine's battlefield. Our Chief Medical Officer is Dr. Laura Purdy, a retired U.S. Army Physician. Red Element is a healthcare management and business development firm that brought American Duty together with its partners.
