■ The valuable use for salt: preservation

Salt that's not salty is useless

Christ's disciples "are the light of the world" (Mt. 5:14-16)

- Light in a world of spiritual darkness
- "The" light = Christ's light (Jn. 8:12; 9:5; Eph. 5:8)
- We shine the light by pointing to Christ
- We shine the light by reflecting Christ's character (1 Pt. 2:9)
- We shine the light by Christlike good works (Mt. 5:16)
- We shine the light publicly (Mt. 5:14-15)
