Our Backpack Support Program helps children access food over the weekends.



Who We Serve

Many of our guests are adults who work at low-wage jobs. Others are struggling with a medical crisis or are living with a disability. Some are caring for children or are seniors who live on a fixed income.

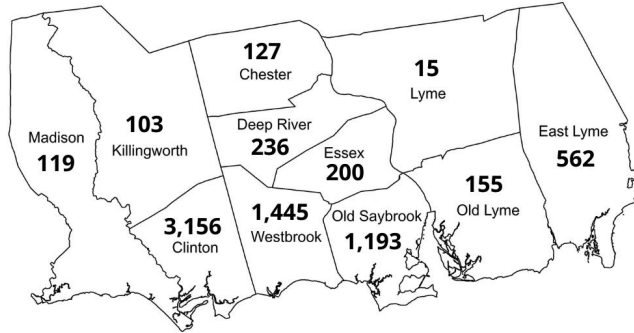
Families of four or more make up 45% of our guests. Children and teens make up 31% of those receiving food, 15% are seniors, and 19% live alone.

Each guest is facing unique challenges, and all are welcomed with dignity, respect, and compassion.

Every day our small staff and hard-working volunteers are sharing food with your neighbors in need throughout our 11 towns.

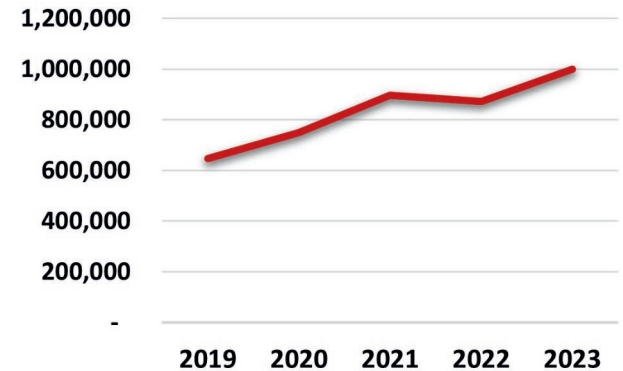
Our food pantries and meal sites are hosted by thirteen faith communities. We are truly grateful to our host sites for their generous support!
