

Elizabeth S. Kaufman, MD is Professor of Medicine at Case Western Reserve University, Clinical Cardiac Electrophysiologist at MetroHealth Medical Center, and Director of the Familial Heart Rhythm Program at MetroHealth. She received her undergraduate degree from Yale University and her medical degree from Harvard Medical School. She completed her internal medicine residency and fellowships in Cardiovascular Disease and Clinical Cardiac Electrophysiology at Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center in New York. Dr. Kaufman came to MetroHealth Medical Center in July of 1991 to start up the electrophysiology program. Her research interests include abnormalities of repolarization and non-invasive risk stratification in structural heart disease and in congenital long QT syndrome and other genetic heart rhythm disorders. Dr. Kaufman is a Fellow of the American College of Cardiology and of the Heart Rhythm Society and of the American Heart Association. She serves on several editorial boards, including *Circulation: Arrhythmia and Electrophysiology*, whose Gold Reviewer Recognition Award she received in 2018, and the *Journal of the American College of Cardiology*, whose Simon Dack Award for Outstanding Scholarship she received in 2012. In addition, she has served on hospital, university, and professional society committees (including chairing a faculty senate subcommittee and an ACC grant review committee). Currently she is a member of the Scientific and Clinical Documents Committee of the Heart Rhythm Society and the American Heart Association Electrophysiology and Arrhythmias Committee.
