The Possibility Project that I explained last month is off and running. I recently got an updated report on how Nebraska-Iowa Clubs are doing in supporting this effort to raise \$25,000,000 to impact the lives of 10,000,000 children in our own communities. As you recall, all club and individual donations since Oct. 1, 2022 have gone towards the Possibility Project. As of the end of August, Nebraska-Iowa clubs have donated \$179,711.29. That's outstanding! Remember, there is no District Pledge for this project and the only Club Recognition opportunity is to be an Impact Club—sign up to raise an average of \$500 dollars per member.

Do you assess every member \$500? No. Your club donation, any individual donations, and any funds raised towards the project count for the \$500 per member average. The Champion for each area will pass along information about how individual clubs and divisions are doing in raising funds. Does your club have an idea for raising funds for this project that you would be willing to share? Let your Champion know.

It helps that I work at Worldly Goods once a week. I raid the cash register and trade out my regular dollars for "K" Dollars that I find.
