



Official Call to the 2020 Larimer County Republican Assembly/Convention

Pursuant to the emergency authorization granted by the Executive Committee of the Colorado State Republican Party, the Colorado State General Assembly under House Bill 20-1359, and the Colorado Governor's Executive Order #D-2020 005, notice is hereby given that the Larimer County Republican Assembly/Convention will convene at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, March 21st, 2020, at the Larimer GOP Headquarters at 4020 S. College Ave. Fort Collins, CO 80525. **No delegates should attend or appear on Saturday, March 21st, 2020!!**

Voting for the Assembly/Convention will occur by mail-in ballot. Ballots will be formally mailed at 12 p.m. on March 20th. Voting will be open until Thursday, March 26th, at 7 p.m. **Ballots received after that date and time will not be counted. Furthermore, no proxy voting will be permitted, but individuals may carry and deposit an unlimited number of ballots on behalf of other eligible voters.** A Select County Assembly Committee (SCAC) of nine members has been organized at the behest of the County Chairman to oversee all essential Assembly/Convention deliberations and ensure compliance with all relevant CDC guidelines constraining public gatherings to ten individuals or less. The SCAC will be comprised of the following nine individuals, **who will be the only persons to appear at the Larimer GOP Headquarters on March 21st:**

The SCAC will recess on March 21st after being called to order. It will then reconvene in order to proceed with the business of the Assembly/Convention on Friday, March 27th at 3:00 p.m. after mail-in vote results have been received and counted. Following the completion of all essential business, the County Assembly/Convention will adjourn formally on March 27th.

A total of 750 delegates and alternates have been authorized by the Executive Committee of the Larimer County Republican Party for this Assembly/Convention. The purpose of the Assembly/Convention is to transact the following business:

1. **Ratification** of nominees for precinct committee people for each of the precincts in the county.
2. **Nomination and Designation** of Republican candidates for the offices of County Commissioner for Larimer County Commissioner District 2 and Commissioner District 3.
3. **Ratification** of 276 delegates and alternates to the Republican State Assembly/Convention
4. **Ratification** of 276 delegates and alternates to the Republican 2nd Congressional District Assembly
5. **Ratification** of delegates and alternates to the 49th State House District and to the 23rd State Senate District Assemblies.
6. **Ratification** of delegates and alternates to the Colorado 8th Judicial District Assembly
7. **Designation** of the Larimer County 2020 Republican Candidate Vacancy Committee.
8. **Vote** on resolutions submitted to the Assembly/Convention pursuant to County Party bylaws. Resolutions can be found at larimergop.org.
9. **Transact** other such business as may properly come before the Assembly/Convention.

Notice is also given on behalf of the respective District Chairmen that the following single-county Republican District Assemblies shall be convened in connection with this County Assembly in order to: 1) nominate and designate Republican candidates to the 2020 Primary Election ballot, and 2) transact other such business that may come before the committee. Delegates and alternates to the Larimer County Republican Assembly residing in these districts shall serve in their respective capacities to these District Assemblies:

**State Representative Districts 51, 52, and 53
State Senatorial District 14**

The following multi-county Republican District Assemblies shall convene at a future date and time to be determined. The delegates and alternates to the Larimer County Republican Assembly residing in the following districts shall serve in their respective capacities to these District Assemblies, and shall cast votes according to the proportion of active registered Republican voters in the Larimer County portion of the multi-county District except in the event that the District provides specific numbers of delegates and alternates to be proportioned according to the active registered Republican voters in the Larimer County portion of the multi-county district:
