

Modified Distance Learning Plan Update: 7-27-20

Modified Distance Learning (MDL) is a combination of attending on campus classes remotely and video instruction, assignments, and activities. MDL is available through an application process for any student who cannot be on campus for an extended period of time (10 or more days) because of pre-existing health conditions or other risk factors.

We are excited to announce that *Modified Distance Learning (MDL) Coordinators* will be paired with each MDL student solely for the purpose of providing support and personalized learning sessions with the student each week on a regular basis.

Timeline for Modified Distance Learning

August 3	Class placements are announced. Students participating in MDL are full members of the classroom community. Their primary teacher is on campus and provides all curriculum, instruction, assignments, assessments, and grades. A MDL Coordinator is assigned to each MDL student for the sole purpose of providing overall support and personalized learning sessions for students throughout each week.
August 12	MDL students will receive a daily schedule from their classroom teacher. Details about access to live, real-time lessons and video lessons and assignments will be provided.
August 19	First day of school!

Classroom Teacher Responsibilities:

- Lesson plans posted on the Parent Portal with an overview of topics and content for the week
- Zoom morning meeting sessions each day with teacher and classmates
- Daily assignments/activities posted in SeeSaw or Google Classroom for independent work
- Combination of live and video instruction
- Instructional technology sites utilized and tailored to each child's learning needs
- One meeting via video/phone call at a mutually agreed upon time each week with MDL students before school, during planning time, or after school

Modified Distance Learning Coordinator

- Communicates regularly with classroom teachers about curriculum and student progress
- Reviews all lessons plans, curriculum content, assignments, and activities via SeeSaw or Google Classroom
- Collaborates with classroom teacher to modify academic plans when necessary
- Provides regular support, personalized learning, and tutorial sessions each week
- Available via phone/video conference for support during posted office hours
