
Happy Fall, Woodbury!

The Annual City of Woodbury Car Show rolls into town on Saturday, Sept. 4. This event is free for spectators and is much more than a car show. It has been a tradition in Woodbury for over 35 years!

The city closes off Broad Street between Cooper Street and Salem Avenue/Kings Highway and downtown is transformed into a festival atmosphere, complete with live band, beer garden, food vendors, and other treats and surprises that make it a spectacle of an event!

This Labor Day tradition is regarded as one of the premier car shows in the Delaware Valley, because of the variety of vehicles on display and the event's walkability.

Another positive feature is the no-pressure judging at this show. There are 31 trophies, which includes Top 10 Kids choice, Top 10 Military choice, and Top 10 City Choice. The 31st Trophy and top prize is the Mayor's Choice Award.

The Woodbury Car Show allows Woodbury an opportunity to shine! Promoting the city in a positive way is our biggest goal. Many Broad Street businesses will be open and offering specials throughout the day. Businesses uptown are really stepping up to the plate to make the Woodbury Car Show a fun Americana experience to remember.

September 6th, **Americans will celebrate Labor Day** - a holiday that marks the end of summer and celebrates American workers achievements over the years with parades, parties and picnics.

The history that is behind this holiday is less festive.

In the height of the Industrial Revolution, workers; including women, children, and recent immigrants; often worked 7 days a week for 12 hours a day in sometimes abhorent and unsafe conditions throughout America's mines, factories and mills.

Labor unions began to find a voice and organize to advocate for worker's rights – often initiating strikes and rallies.

On June 28th, 1894, Congress approved a national holiday to recognize the achievements and contributions of American Workers. Signed by President Grover Cleveland, it was an attempt to improve relationships and cooperation with the workforce.

U11/U12 (Novice)


U13/U14 (Juvenile)
