



Overview of Scholarships:

4-H Foundation Renewable – (sponsored by Douglas County 4-H Foundation) two \$2,500 scholarships available which will be awarded each year to each recipient who is a graduating high school senior, who is an active Douglas County 4-H member, in good standing, can be received for a period of no less than 5 years. Total you could receive is \$10,000.

4-H Community Service Scholarship – (sponsored by Douglas County 4-H Foundation and Young Farmer's and Homemakers Organization) \$1,000 for use at any accredited institution of advanced education for the first year of enrollment.

Youth Farmers & Homemaker's – (sponsored by Young Farmers & Homemaker's Organization) \$2,000 stipend for one academic year. If awarded you may apply for a renewal for the following year that was awarded.

4-Y Youth Council – The amount of \$1,000 scholarships available depends on the amount of money that is received at the Livestock Sale Buy Backs. This year we will be able to award seven (7) \$1,000 scholarships.

Horse – (sponsored by the Horse Steering Committee) \$500 scholarship for current Horse Project 4-H member in good standing.
