



Labor trafficking is modern-day slavery in which individuals are made to perform labor or services using force, fraud, or coercion. Labor trafficking includes situations of debt bondage, forced labor, and involuntary child labor.

Wage theft is the denial of wages or employee benefits rightfully owed to an employee.

The San Diego County District Attorney is committed to supporting victims of labor trafficking abuse and workplace justice violations. Citizenship is not a requirement to report fraudulent activity in the State of California. It is your right to be paid your legally or contractually promised wages.

COMMON INDUSTRIES IN WHICH LABOR VIOLATIONS ARE FOUND INCLUDE:

- Agriculture
- Car Wash
- Construction
- Garment
- Hotel/Domestic Work
- Janitorial
- Massage Parlors
- Restaurant
- Residential Care Facilities
- Warehouse

Together with the Labor Commission and our law enforcement partners, we're working to deliver justice for workers who are abused by dishonest employers. Wage theft and labor trafficking are serious problems that should be addressed.
