Our Generosity in August

Your offerings to St. John were shared beyond our walls in July in the Following ways:

8% of our regular August offering (\$2186.02) went to support the mission of the larger church.

2% of our total offering goes to support our community needs. In August (\$701.44) was given to the Southeastern Synod of the ELCA to help victims of the Derecho disaster in that part of the state.

The Finance Board designates the 8% of the total Thank Offering quarterly. A total of \$2093.31 from the second quarter was also given to the Southeastern Synod to go towards disaster relief.

In addition, donations of \$1425.00 were given by our members for recovery from the Derecho disaster. Gifts for disaster relief are still being accepted.

Members and Friends of St. John Lutheran,

The Church Council has made the decision to begin offering a weekly in-person worship option in addition to our weekly online and radio services. **We will have one, in-person service on Sundays at 9 AM.**

Pastor Russ has put a video on the St. John YouTube channel to inform you of the In-Person Worship Safety Procedures. Go to the St. John website – www.stjohncharlescity.org, click on the Worship & Sermon tab, then choose YouTube.

The following instructions were taken from the in-person worship plan and are intended to help make the in-person worship experience meaningful and safe:

- There will be a limit of 50 people for each worship service to maintain social distancing.
- All worshippers will need to register by 4 PM on Thursday before the Sunday service by calling the church office. Only registered worshipers will be admitted.
- Entry and exit will be through the main doors which will open at 8:45 AM Sundays. Worshipers will need to check-in with a greeter as they enter the building.
- Face masks will be required for those five years and older. We will provide a face mask for anybody who needs one.
- All worshipers will be ushered to their seats to maintain physical distancing between family groups.
- Communion will be offered at every service so that it's available whenever worshipers are able to attend.
- We will not be singing or speaking in unison, any singing and responsive readings will be pre-recorded.

- The nursery will not be available during the service.

Fall greetings to you all from your friends at St. John Christian Preschool! We have already been in school for five weeks and we've gone from wearing shorts and tank tops to long sleeves and jackets! We have come from a few tears (from both child and parent ☺) to friends who are excited to come in and see what the preschool day will hold for them. It is amazing to see how confident and comfortable our friends have become with their preschool routine. We thank God for His constant presence in our preschool center.

Our beginning unit was called: All About Me! We learned that God created each of us in His image and that we are all special because of that! We also focused on learning the names of our teachers and friends. We practiced number recognition, completed some projects that helped develop our small motor muscles, and also practiced patterning. Play Pumpkin Bean Bag Toss: For a creative DIY craft and fun family game all in one, carve pumpkins that you can use to play a bean bag toss game. After you're done playing, you can use the pumpkins as festive Halloween decorations.

Roasted Pumpkin Seeds: Preheat oven to 350°F. Toss 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups whole pumpkin seeds with 2 Tbl. melted butter and a $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp of salt. Spread the seeds in a single layer on a baking sheet and bake for about 45 minutes or until golden brown; stir occasionally
