One of the most memorable weddings I was ever a part of, was also one of the stormiest. A sprinkling of rain fell lightly onto guests as they arrived at the church for the ceremony. By time the service started, it was thundering and lightning. As I shared the wedding message, a hard, drenching rain started to pound against the church roof. During the exchange of vows the rain turned into golf ball-sized hail. The noise made it almost impossible to hear the bride and groom. And just as the service ended, the tornado sirens began to blare. Instead of the bride and groom processing out of the church, the whole congregation had to process to the church basement!

Luckily, no tornado actually touched down that day and, as far as I know, the couple's marriage hasn't been as stormy as their wedding. We did, however, keep all of the local insurance agents busy for weeks processing automobile hail damage claims (it was a small town and almost everyone in town was at the wedding).

Like it or not, storms happen. It's part of life. We buy sump pumps for our basements, snow blowers for our driveways, and insurance for our property, because we know there's a storm coming. The question isn't "Will there be a storm?" but "How will we handle the storms when they come?" So, we prepare for the worst and hope for the best. That goes for the weather, and it goes for life.

As we continue to face the storm that COVID-19 has brought to our lives, in addition to all of the other storms, I want to remind us that we have a shelter from the storms of life in Jesus. He knows your griefs and fears. He knows your joys and sorrows. He's as close to you as the air you breathe, and he wants you to talk to him. He's already overcome the evil of this world and has saved a place for you in his Father's house for eternity. He's the Head of a Church that cares about you.

Even though we're sacrificing our meeting together for the moment, so that we can keep those who are at risk safe, Christ is still very much at work through his Church. We continue to support the Northeast Iowa Food Bank as they help those in our community who are food insecure. We continue to put out weekly worship services on the radio and online, so that we can encounter Christ in our homes and daily, pandemic lives. We continue to pray and offer support in Jesus' name over the phone. We're having video and email meetings to take care of and plan for the ministries Jesus is calling us to. Last week we offered a 3-day Online VBS for families to learn about Jesus together at home. We're planning a brief Parking Lot Service on August 16 at 10:30 AM for those who long to worship Jesus in a safe, communal setting. We will be offering Drive-Thru Communion in the near future, so that we can safely experience the presence of Christ in His body and blood.

Jesus has not abandoned you in the storm. He is your storm shelter in the midst of it ... and so are we. We may not be able to take the storm away, but we are here to keep you company and encourage you until it passes.

### **Our Generosity in June**

Your offerings to St. John were shared beyond our walls in May in the following ways:

8% of our regular May offering (\$1597.68) went to support the mission of the larger church.

2% of our total offering goes to support our community needs. In June (\$517.32) was given to "Stitches Fabric and Yarn" for expenses associated with sewing cloth face masks for many groups and individuals in the community.

The Finance Board designates the 8% of the total Thank Offering quarterly and would welcome any suggestions of beneficiaries for these funds. Just call the church office.

St. John is enacting **Phase 1 of our reopening plan. This means that we will...**

- Maintain worshiping through radio and internet services.
- Funerals and weddings may occur in the sanctuary should they be permitted by law (but will be encouraged to occur outdoors). These gatherings are limited to ten people or less in the entire facility.
  - Persons participating in a funeral or wedding are required to certify verbally they are not experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19 as outlined by the CDC. They are required to verbally certify they have not been with anyone who is sick or experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 as outlined by the CDC.
  - Do not attend or visit the church if you are feeling ill, have been exposed to COVID-19, have a compromised immune system, or are at high risk of exposing others. You are responsible for your own health and also that of your neighbor.
  - A record of the people attending the funeral or wedding will be kept to help with contact tracing should one of the attendees become ill.
  - Participants are to maintain proper social distancing of six feet or more.
  - **Participants are to wear a face mask at all times when in the building.**
  - Participants are to practice proper hand hygiene (soap and water or 60%+ alcohol hand sanitizer) immediately upon entry into the building.
  - The church will be cleaned and sanitized after the event.
- **The church office will continue to operate; however, the church building will remain locked to visitors.** If a visitor is invited into the building, any people present must adhere to the guidelines above in relation to a funeral or wedding.
- If any visitor to the church becomes ill, they must inform the church so others who may have had contact with the visitor may monitor their own health.
- Church council and board meetings must occur electronically.

#### **CDC guidelines for Covid prevention: Wash your hands often**

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- It's especially important to wash:
  - Before eating or preparing food
  - Before touching your face
  - After using the restroom
  - After leaving a public place
  - After blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing
  - After handling your cloth face covering
  - After changing a diaper
  - After caring for someone sick
  - After touching animals or pets
- If soap and water are not readily available, **use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.** Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.
- **Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth** with unwashed hands.

### What season of the church are we in now?

#### PENTECOST!

The season of Pentecost is the longest season in the Christian Church year. It begins the Monday following the Day of Pentecost and lasts until the season of Advent begins. It lasts anywhere between 22 and 27 weeks, depending on when Easter takes place. The season of Pentecost is often referred to as the non-festival half of the church year because during this time the Christian Church does not celebrate a major festival commemorating the life of Jesus. During the season of Pentecost, the Christian Church focuses on the teachings of Jesus. During the season of Pentecost, the Christian Churches celebrate other special festivals such as Reformation Sunday, All Saints Day, Thanksgiving, and others.
