Pastor Russ Leeper :

Several years ago, I purchased a fire pit for our back yard. It was, basically, a deep metal ring with a lip that was placed into the middle of a circle of built-up landscaping blocks. It seemed simple enough that even I could build it. And yet, as I was bolting together the parts that make up the ring, somehow, I managed to hit myself in the face with the wrench! I laid on the ground with a small trickle of blood on my chin and I couldn't help but laugh at myself. I'm so bad with tools that I couldn't even bolt together two pieces of metal without causing injury to myself.

As I lay there trying to decide if I was going to tell my wife what had just happened, I thought about how few and far between my home improvement successes have been over the years and I started to feel a little sorry for myself. I just didn't inherit my dad's skill at fixing and building things and I was feeling pretty useless. But then, I realized that my dad may be much better at using tools than I am, but he's never preached a sermon or kept the attention of 15 confirmation students for 45 minutes or steered a canoe or made a video, and that's the stuff that I'm good at.

I think that often we're reluctant to offer our gifts and talents at church because we think that our particular gifts aren't needed or valued. But the truth is, we can use the particular gifts that God has given you! We need people who can use tools without injury and we need people who can teach without fear. We need people who are good with technology and people who are good with children. We need people who can steer a canoe and people who can steer a board. The gifts you have were given to you for a reason, and part of that reason is because we need them!

But here's the thing ... you know what your gifts are and we don't. So, we depend on you to let us know what you can do and to step up when you see the opportunity to use them. That's what makes the church work and that's what keeps things fresh and interesting at St. John! So, let us know what you're good at and we'll find a way to use your gifts!

Coming in June: The prayer shawl group will continue on the 1st and 3rd Fridays of the month. The 2nd & 4th Friday will be a Craft Time! We will make some items for the **150th Anniversary** dinner and craft fair in October. This **crafting session** will start with simple projects at first. One possible project will be the LOVE folded book pictured on the right. Materials will be provided.

We are asking for crafting material from anyone who has extra to donate! So, clean out your junk craft drawers, closets, and bookshelves! We need bits and pieces of lots of things. If you're a crafter, you understand.

Items we need: please bring them to the church.

***Paperback books any kind and hard back books** 350-500 pages. The page ends need to be clean and the pages not old and stiff.

***Ribbon** cloth type (not curling ribbon or paper), 1/2 inch to one inch. Plain colors are best, but buffalo check and even a Christmas print would be good.

***Bling** like **strings** of pearls, rhinestones, beads (Like from dollar store). Beads should be on the petite side, less than 1/4 inch.(Or some bling are in 1-inch rows but can be cut down.)

***Buttons** that are unique are also great. Christmas ones also a plus.

***Flat lace** around 1/2-1 inch. white, beige or colors that are kind of antique would be best. Maybe even a red or green could be used. flat on one side and wavy on the other side is fancier, but wider straight will work.

***Silk type flowers and leaves.** Mostly like 1-2.5 inch, but some bigger ones are OK. We would even like some of the flowers that are burlap and burlap ribbon.

*If you have some **snowflake** sequins or table scatters that would work into the crafts, too.

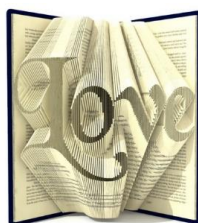
***Mini glue sticks** we go through them like water.

*An **extra glue gun** would be helpful.

*Also, the prayer shawl group could use some cotton, **dishcloth yarn** in solid colors. Variegated doesn't work for the prayer cloths.

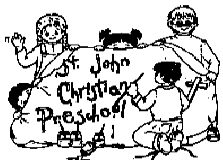

It's hard to be unhappy when God blesses us with a beautiful springtime world! While it was sad to say good-bye to our little ones who are moving on to Kindergarten, it is a blessing to be able to continue touching the lives of new friends who will enter our preschool in the fall.

We are excited to welcome many of our preschool friends back for classes next year and are also anxious to meet many new friends. We do have a few openings in our program, but spots are filling up fast! Our morning class is open to any child who will be at least 3 on or before September 15, 2022. So please let us know if you or someone you know is looking for a preschool for his/her 3-year-old! Our afternoon classes (there is a 3-day and 5-day option) are open to any child who will be at least 4 on or before September 15, 2022. Please call the preschool (228-7274) if you would like more information.

We, also, wanted to update everyone on the situation pertaining to joining the district under Statewide Voluntary Preschool Program. Yes, SJCP will be joining the district as a community partner in the Statewide Voluntary Preschool Program (SWVPP). We will be meeting with the administration team at Washington Elementary soon to discuss the ins-and-outs of the program. With that said, being under the SWVPP will only pertain to our 4-year-old program. SWVPP gives all 4-year-olds the opportunity to receive high-quality early childhood education at no cost to the family. We will still be upholding our faith-based mission and instruction in both classes; however, faith-based instruction will be limited in our 4-year-old program. Also to note, the SWVPP gives each school a certain amount of money for each 4-year-old that attends that particular preschool program. These monies will greatly help us financially. If you have any questions about this program, I will do my best to answer them! I'm still learning about it, as well. ☺
