### Intern Beth Hurt

Dear Congregation,

As we step into the heart of summer, many of us turn our attention to the 4<sup>th</sup> of July- this is a time to celebrate the gift of freedom and reflect on what it means. This year I find myself asking, "Can I really live in freedom when my neighbor does not?" From a completely individualistic point of view maybe it is possible, depending on how we spin the definition of freedom. I think, though, that freedom calls to our spirits because it means more than Oxford's definition of "the power or right to act, speak, or think as one wants without hindrance or restraint." As Christians we recognize that we are connected by the power of the Holy Spirit and that each human being is a beloved child of God created in God's own image. Our freedom is not individualistic but interconnected. While individual liberties and privileges still exist and are afforded to us by the human ordering of society, the lack of freedom for our neighbor significantly impacts the quality and extent of our own experience. The well-being of our communities matters. We are called to not only live in the freedom that Christ has given each of us but in faithful responsibility towards others because when we serve our neighbors, we serve our Savior. Our freedom is not self-serving it is Christ-serving.

Matthew 25:35-36: [Jesus said] "for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me."

In *The Freedom of a Christian*, Martin Luther boldly declares: "A Christian is a perfectly free lord of all, subject to none. A Christian is a perfectly dutiful servant of all, subject to all." While this may sound like a contradiction it is a profound truth of the Christian life. In Christ, we are freed from the burden of trying to earn God's love. We are saved by grace—not by our works, but by God's mercy. That freedom brings deep resounding peace. We no longer need to live in fear of judgement or failure because we know that we belong to God, fully and forever. Luther also reminds us that Christian freedom isn't about doing whatever we want, or our individual liberties. It's about being freed for something—for loving and serving our neighbor. Out of the deep well of God's love, we are empowered to turn outward: to care, to forgive, to act in compassion and justice. We can recognize God's love in action within us because we are called to action beyond us. We are freed by Christ, to express empathy and love boldly in our thoughts, words, and actions. We are freed by Christ so that we may work to set our neighbors free from all the ways that human beings continue to deal death to one another due to the influence of sin.

#### DO YOU REMEMBER THE KAYWOS CLOTH?

These cloths have been inquired about several times over the last few years. So, a supply has again been ordered to support the Women's Ministry in our church. The cost is \$3.00 each or 4/\$10.00!

Ths Kaywos Cloth is a streak free, spot free, lint free and chemical free cleaning cloth. The Kaywos "Zezofiber" cloth cleans with just water. All your glass, mirrors, floors, counters, furniture, stainless, chrome...anything non-porous will come shiny clean with the cloth and water alone! Wet the cloth, wring it out, and you're ready to clean - Never use glass cleaners, polishes and many other chemicals again. The cloth is machine washable with soap and bleach.
