MENTORSHIP REPORT FEBRUARY – MARCH 2026.

Holf Children's Support Christian Foundation plans and implements a work plan that includes time dedicated to providing mentorship to sponsored children in partner schools and University students at the Head office.

The partner schools include Hilton Junior School (Muyuge), Gospel Valley Primary School (Kayunga) and Stevour Christian High School (Nakaseke).

Mentorship Schedule:

- Mentorship visits covered held on the 25th, 26th, and 27th of February at the respective schools.

- Mentorship for University / Vocational students took place on 21st March at our office - Kampala

- Mentorship visits were also held on 25th, 26th, and 27th of March.

Theme: Kingdom Living 2026

We introduced the theme and talked about God's Kingdom using Matthew 20:19-20

We revealed the King in this Kingdom: Jesus Christ. We mentioned who he is and why he is the king of this kingdom. In the next sessions we deliberated on behavior and Academic excellency rewarding the best and improved performers in comparison to term two and term three 2025.

During our second visit in March to our partner schools, we preached the importance of salvation and Baptism to mankind where we saw nine pupils receive salvation and confess Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

On March 21st the University students reported to the office for mentorship. On arrival, all students registered, and then we commenced with greetings including introductions, to build an environment of oneness. We then embarked on prayer, praise and worship, followed by preaching the word revealing Christ and how to always live a Christ like life, closing the session with prayer for the students.

We then tasked them to complete a self-evaluation progress report which required students to conduct a personal academic analysis, a personal spiritual evaluation, and write about their social life challenges while achieving their life goals.

The next sessions covered interactive topics, including Networking, Time Management, and Decision Making, all bringing Christ into the scene of their lives. The question time was an interactive moment where all students participated, giving them an opportunity to give feedback, build friendships, discover their challenges and express their needs. This platform boosted their confidence and sense of support. We ended this with great insightful remarks and words of encouragement academically, spiritually, and socially.
