OUR THEME FOR 2024

CRAFT: THE FUTURE OF YOUTH MINISTRY

Youth ministry is changing. Those who are called to the holy work of caring for young people along their faith journey are facing much different realities than 10 or 15 years ago. Those who have been in youth ministry during or since the pandemic know that youth ministry is different now than it was even 5 years ago.

At this year's Forum on Youth Ministry, we're recognizing the obvious: the people who have the power to determine the future of youth ministry are the people who are doing it! As the real experts in the room, participants at the Forum will join in conversations and activities through workshops with others who have a similar number of years' experience in youth ministry. On Friday morning, representatives from each of these workshops will present their learnings to the entire Forum audience during the Festival of Ideas. Facilitated by some of our favorite thought leaders working in youth ministry today, these workshops will invite participants into the shared work of imagination about the essentials of the art—the **CRAFT**—of youth ministry now and in the future we want to create together.

The APPRENTICE Track

New to youth ministry? Participants with 0-2 years of experience will discern the needs and clarify the hopes of those who are new to the work. In a world that's changing so rapidly, our apprentices are well positioned to speak into the present moment. Unencumbered by expectations of what-has-always-worked, apprentices have the unique capacity to teach us what is or isn't working—now.

The SOJOURNER Track

Been in youth ministry for a few years now? Participants with 3-6 years of experience will connect with others who have learned some best practices and had some great ideas along the way. After mastering the basics and learning their strengths, our sojourners have developed wisdom about staying faithful to their calling in the face of ever-new challenges.

The MAESTRO Track

Lost count of how many years you've been at this? Participants with 7+ years of experience will bring their brilliance to bear as they share their expertise with others in the room. Drawing from time-tested practices and hard-won wisdom, our maestros will share what long obedience in the direction of youth ministry can look like in our lives, in our young people, in the church, and in the world.

The gathered Forum audience will encourage and support one another by mapping resources, sharing gifts, forming friendships, and offering thoughtful feedback with a grand celebration on Friday morning.
