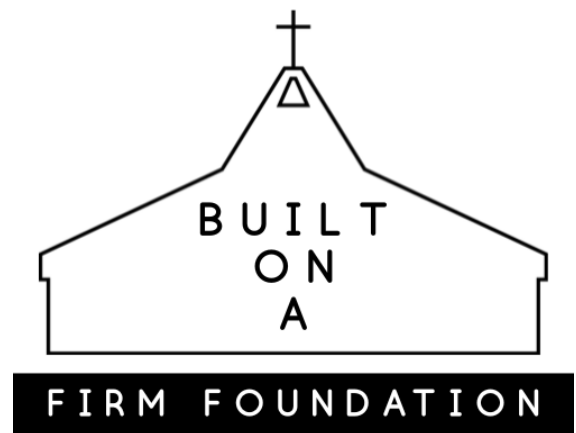

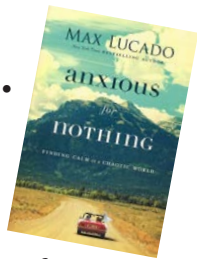

Around the Church

Life of Faith — God Sightings

This fall we are looking for God Sightings. What is a God Sighting? A God Sighting is a spiritual practice of being alert to the presence of God in our daily lives. This practice tunes our awareness and attention so that we more intentionally look and listen for signs of God's activity in and around us. By sharing our stories of God Sightings with others, we gain practice in speaking words about God (also known as theology). By hearing the stories of others, our imagination is deepened so that we anticipate and expect to see signs of God's presence among us.

Here are a few God Sightings you have shared:

1) On Sunday, October 5, St. Stephen members John Dieseth and Marsha Arens shared their experience from their 2019 Westwood Experience on Life of Faith. This experience lead St. Stephen to the Life of Faith Initiative and a discussion of how we might deepen our faith and relationship with God and others in the community.

2) The following is an anonymous story turned in:

I was in a line to order at McDonalds and a lady in front of me with two children was told the cost of her order. She hesitated and then asked the order taker to remove her item from the total but keep the two kid's meals for her children. She then asked, "What would be the new total?" The person in front of me quickly stepped up and gave the order taker his credit card saying, "Here, I got the full amount. Have a good lunch."

3) God Sighting — Jesus Bread

Every Sunday during worship, we get "Jesus Bread" as Charlie calls it. The bread sort of magically appears every Sunday and Wednesday. Unless calamity happens. Every Sunday and Wednesday the elements of Communion magically appear, the candles get lit and the font gets filled with water.

Every Sunday, this is my favorite God Sighting. And it is all due to the dedicated members of the Altar Guild. They tirelessly prepare the sanctuary for worship every time, they support each other, always help one another and bake the bread. And most of the time, no one knows who they are. They are absolutely AMAZING!

So, the next time you get to receive the gift of "Jesus Bread", please remember those wonderful members of the Altar Guild. I thank God for them daily and they are one of my favorite God sightings.
