




From the Pastor


Dear St. Stephen Community,

Do you know what the following terms have in common? Ad break, Bible thumping, breakdance, dead air, dead lifting, jean jacket, midcentury, santoku, ultra-processed, and washi tape?

They all appeared in the *Oxford English Dictionary* for the first time in March 2024!







Why an "updated edition" for the NRSV? The Yale Divinity Library for New Testament studies writes: The NRSVue reflects discoveries of ancient texts [such as the Dead Sea Scrolls] and new insights made in the 30 years since the NRSV was last revised. This newly-updated translation offers clearer, more direct, and inclusive language, and increased cultural sensitivity absent of the unintended biases of prior versions. The NRSVue includes over 10,000 substantial revisions and 20,000 minor revisions.

I'll offer more information and examples of those revisions in the weeks ahead. Stay tuned!

In the meantime, I want to acknowledge that the change may feel awkward at first – even startling! I remember the chagrin in my childhood congregation when we switched from the *Revised Standard Version* (RSV, 1946) to the NRSV, and "I will make you fishers of men" became "I will make you fish for people" (Matthew 4:19). At the same time, change can be energizing. In my six months of using the NRSVue in sermon preparation, I've found that even small updates to familiar passages help me pay closer attention to the word. I hope this will be true for you, as well.

Whatever translation we use, we will continue to keep scripture at the heart of our worship gathering, living out our baptismal promise to "HEAR the Word of God"!

April Congregation Council Meeting Highlights

On April 22, 2025 the Congregational Council met for their monthly meeting. Highlights from the meeting included:



- A focus group conversation around the Life of Faith initiative, reflecting on the impact of the "Called to Relationship" sermon series and small group discussions, and the possibility for more small group discussions.
- Old Business: Proposed plans for improvements and maintenance of our church building in a costeffective manner were presented, and Council approved a Capital Campaign for summer/fall 2025.
 Property Use Policy is currently under review. Review of numerous other St Stephen Policies is underway
 and will take more time to clarify.
- New Business: Council would like to provide opportunities for volunteer engagement and are considering the best ways to make these known to the congregation.
- Other: The new hearing assistance program has been installed

Beware of Scams!

Church communities are frequently targeted by scammers exploiting your generosity and desire to help your neighbors. St. Stephen people continue to encounter two scams:

- Gift Card Scam: Scammers imitating Pastor Andrea send phony email and text messages asking for a "favor" or seeking "confidential and discreet assistance with a request." The scammers are often convincing in making the matter seem urgent! The goal of the scam is to have you purchase gift cards and send them the gift card's number. Once they have that number, the money is stolen!
- *Membership Directory Scam*: The scammer is after a copy of the membership directory. They might pretend to be a member who "lost their contacts" with a new phone, or they might pretend to be a new member. The goal is to identify targets for the gift card scam.

Unfortunately, there's no easy way to stop scammers! The best strategy to protect our community is to learn how to recognize scams and avoid them. Always remember:

- Avoid "phishing" scams by checking the sender's email address or phone number for accuracy. Any genuine message from St. Stephen staff will end with <u>@ststephenlutheran.org</u> (not @gmail.com). All staff phone numbers have a 515 area code.
- Pastor Andrea and members of staff will never ask you to purchase gift cards in this way.
- Never share your Online Directory login information, or other member lists.
- Another red flag is misspellings and grammar errors. Are names spelled correctly?

When in doubt, the best course of action is to ignore and delete the message, and/or block the phone number.

New Hearing Devices for Worship

In April, Communication Innovators installed our new hearing assistive devices for worship. These devices have replaced the old headsets and are essentially a smartphone, which connect to headphones, ear bud or a loop. We will also have information available soon about additional options for installing an app on your phone, or using bluetooth headphones. Please see specifics below, or ask an usher for assistance on Sunday mornings.



Hearing Devices **Available**

- Select your preferred headset from the basket: ear bud, headphones or loop (loop is for use with hearing aid).
- Plug headset in to hearing device (jack is on the bottom of the device).
- Press right side button to turn screen on.
- Press ST-STEPHEN-HEAR on screen.
- Press red speaker icon to un-mute the sound.
- Adjust volume and you're ready to go.
