Important Update from Pastor Andrea Myers

(from Friday, July 18, 2025)

Dear St. Stephen community -

As you may already know, I have been struggling with fatigue and shortness of breath since late June. After many tests, doctor visits, and several blood transfusions, we learned this week that I have Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL).

The treatment protocols for ALL are aggressive, and require immediate action. On Monday, July 21, I will meet with specialists at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN for further evaluation and treatment planning.

I met with the Congregation Council on Thursday night, and we've begun work on a strategy to cover pastoral leadership needs during the time I'm receiving treatment. St. Stephen is blessed with excellent and capable staff and lay leadership, and I have great confidence in their ability to care for St. Stephen while my attention is turned elsewhere. I've also been in conversation with Bishop Amy Current, and the synod staff will offer their assistance as well.

Things are moving very quickly. There are many things we do not yet know about my illness or what the next weeks will look like. I don't yet know what kinds of help will be most helpful to Ronald and me. Please stay tuned to worship announcements and St. Stephen emails for updates.

In the meantime, I covet your prayers for me, for Ronald, and our healthcare team.

As many of you have heard, Pastor Andrea has recently received a serious medical diagnosis. Her treatment is expected to continue for several months, possibly up to a year. During this time, we ask that you continue to lift up Pastor Andrea and Pastor Ronald in your prayers.

The synod is already working closely with us to arrange for an interim pastor. In the month of August, Pastor Chris Lang and Pastor Les Walck will be leading worship and presiding over services. Pastor Chris Lang will also be available to provide pastoral care as needed.

Please know that your church council is here for you. We are committed to supporting the congregation during this time and are happy to answer any questions you may have. Our staff will continue regular operations and step in where needed to keep everything running smoothly.

Dear Members of St. Stephen Lutheran Church,

The Congregation Council has called a special meeting to seek approval for moving forward with an updated Deferred Maintenance Project List, including an elevator contract and flood mitigation work, totaling up to \$350,000.

Since the original maintenance list was approved in May 2024 (which excluded the elevator), several major rainstorms have prompted additional projects, including roof work and landscape grading. We now have a pending elevator bid and a strategy for flood mitigation. The Council is asking for authorization to enter contracts and take out a short-term loan of \$200,000 to complete the full scope of work.

Under our bylaws, congregational approval is required for unbudgeted projects exceeding 5% of anticipated revenue. The bid for the elevator alone is \$150,000. Grouping all proposed and carryover projects together, the total cost is just over \$350,000.

The projects will be paid for using the remaining funds from the house sale (approximately \$100,000) and the short-term loan. Funds raised through the fall 2025 Built on a Firm Foundation Capital Campaign will be used to repay the loan and cover any additional costs, with the balance set aside in the facility designated fund so that we can quickly and responsibly respond to future needs.

The 2025 Deferred Maintenance Project List includes:

Mechanical:

- Elevator modernization & code updates
- HVAC replacement (phased)

Exterior:

- Gutter replacement, metal roof pitch/seal, shingle repairs
- Flood mitigation via grading
- Parking lot signage (carryover)

• Interior (carryover):

- Sanctuary lighting
- Gathering area acoustics
- Downstairs kitchen updates; hallway painting
- South entrance lighting
- Office wing paint & carpet

Approval requires a majority vote of members present and voting (C10.06). No proxy or absentee votes permitted (C10.05). This vote is the sole agenda item.





Complete Work in Three Critical Areas:


Exterior \$61,000 — Improvements to protect the building during strong rainstorms, and improve lighting and signage




