

Welcome to St. John's new ministry for those looking for ways to respond to the current threats to our democracy, based on our Christian and Episcopalian faith. We believe that, as people of faith, we cannot remain neutral about the choices before us and must stand for the future of democracy in our nation. You have received this newsletter because you expressed interest in this new ministry, because you are clergy or because you lead another ministry that might be interested in participating.

Our goal is to provide opportunities for prayer, education and action based on Episcopal Church leadership statements and policy positions. Many of us are overwhelmed by recent assaults on our jobs, our government, our institutions and our Democracy. We hope to reduce a sense of helplessness and

replace it with a sense of purpose, making our voices and our faith values heard.


