Jan. 26 — St. John's archivist Cathy O'Donnell and parishioner Jay Mallin dip into the parish archives, county land records and other historic documents to tell part of the story of how race influenced the founding and early years of St. John's and its neighborhoods.

Feb. 16 — St. John's **Eco-Task Force** suggests ways parishioners can observe an Earth-friendly Lent by committing to making specific changes in food, transportation, home energy use and consumption.
