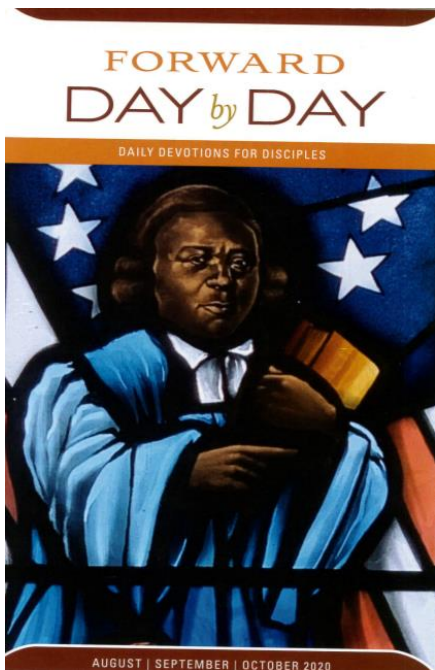
- Send a copy to cookbook@sttimothy.ca ... it can be a photo, scanned, handwritten or typed copy (we will accept any form)

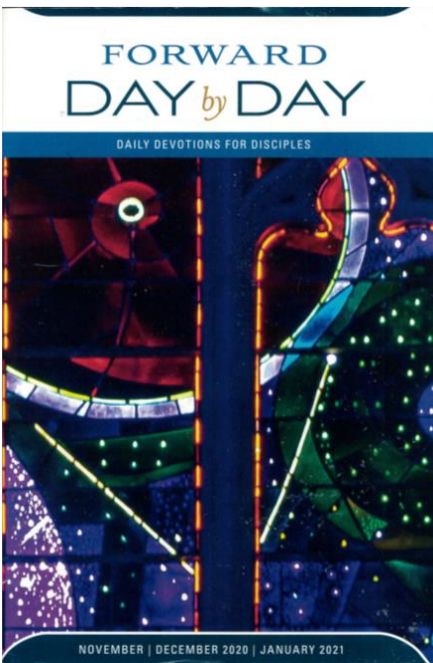

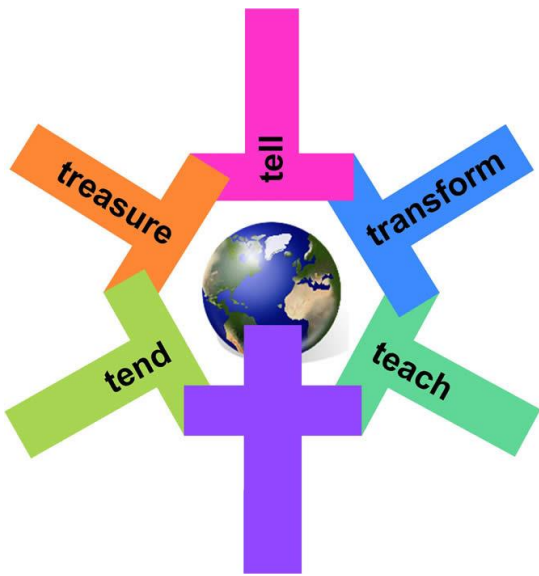
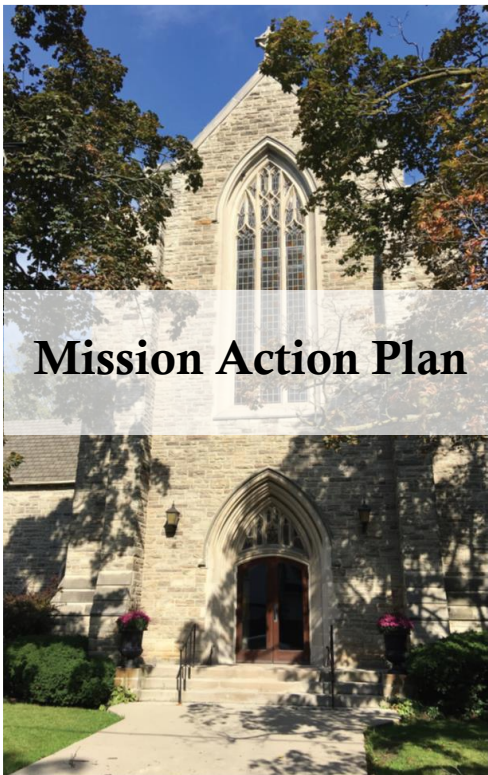
Mission Action Planning

Mission Action Planning is a process that helps parishes envision, plan, decide and act for growth within our neighbourhoods. The process helps us focus our resources on goals and actions that clarify where we are in the community, and the opportunities that are present for ministry. We will assess the strengths and challenges we have as a congregation and ask what God’s call to our parish is as we reach out to our neighborhoods.

A small steering team began this process of discernment in June. Over the next few months, we will explore within our parish and with our neighbourhood, what it means to be “the large Anglican parish on Old Orchard Rd”. The process of figuring this out begins by listening, observing, and engaging in conversations to build and deepen relationship with members of the church and people in the community.

Why are we doing this? Because we are part of the “Jesus movement”. We like church, we benefit and grow because of our relationship with God. Through us, in our community, others ought to see that this world is brimming with kindness, animated by justice, passionate about the environment and flooded with the presence of Jesus.

Now, we have begun the process of figuring out the best way to do it.

- Pre-Authorized Giving (PAG) – If you are already on pre-authorized giving you do not need to do anything and we are very grateful for your continued support.

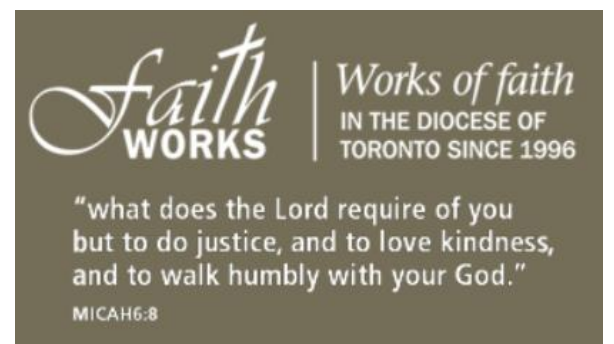

FaithWorks

We are excited to report that we have now achieved 59% of our 2020 goal to raise \$17,500 for FaithWorks! Donations received to date at the parish office and those made directly to the Diocese total \$10,250. Thank you to those contributors who have made this possible!!



We are also excited to pass along the recent Diocesan announcement of a new \$100,000 Matching Challenge Grant for parishes. For every increased dollar a parish offers to FaithWorks over last year's total, a very generous donor will match it with another dollar up to a total of \$100,000!

In 2019 St. Timothy's raised \$17,010.82 for FaithWorks, and our challenge is to now exceed this amount and trigger the challenge grant.
