

Welcome to St. Timothy's!

We are an Anglican church with a deep commitment to community. We seek to live our faith in a spirit of welcome for all, compassion for those in need, and a willingness to approach our faith and our culture with inquiring minds.

We are people who, together, long to welcome, serve, and understand. We hope that you will experience that welcome and, if you are a visitor, consider making us your church home.

This sacred land is the territory of several indigenous Nations – the Wendat, the Haudenosaunee, and the Anishnaabe, with special recognition to the Mississaugas of New Credit.

We also acknowledge that we are on the shores of Niigaani-gichigami/Lake Ontario. This territory is governed by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Treaty, an agreement between the Haudenosaunee Confederacy and the Anishnaabe Confederacy to peaceably share and sustain the life of the Great Lakes. In the spirit of that Treaty we seek to place at the centre of our gatherings the values of respectful reciprocity, diversity, peace, responsibility, and mutual aid.

"Glory to the newborn King."**


Christ, by highest heaven adored;

Gloria in excelsis Deo!



The Celebration of the Eucharist

Prayer over the Gifts

Celebrant: Jesus, your birth at Bethlehem draws us to kneel in wonder at heaven touching earth: accept our heartfelt praise as we worship you, our Saviour and our God.

All: **Amen.**

Eucharistic Prayer

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

People: **And also with you.**

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

People: **We lift them to the Lord.**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**



Celebrant: It is always right to give you thanks, God our Creator, loving and faithful, holy and strong. You made us and the whole universe and filled your world with life.

You sent your Son to live among us, Jesus our Saviour, Mary's child. He suffered on the cross; he died to save us from our sins; he rose in glory from the dead.

You send your Spirit to bring new life to the world and clothe us with power from on high. And so, we join the angels to celebrate and sing:

All: Nowell, Nowell, Nowell, Nowell,
born is the King of Israel.

Celebrant: Father, on the night before he died, Jesus shared a meal with his friends. He took the bread and thanked you. He broke it, and gave it to them, saying: "Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this to remember me."

After the meal, Jesus took the cup of wine. He thanked you, and gave it to them, saying: "Drink this, all of you. This is my blood, the new promise of God's unfailing love. Do this to remember me."

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

All: Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.

Celebrant: Father, as we offer this bread and wine, and remember his death and resurrection, send your Holy Spirit, that we who share these gifts may be fed by Christ's body and his blood. And so, on this holy night, we pray for all Christians, far and near, that we may be one.

We pray for wise leaders and gentle shepherds to guide all nations.

We pray for peace on earth, and good will to all people.

We pray for strength for those who are suffering, and joy for those who are lonely.

We pray for our families and friends, and for those who need our care.

Pour your Spirit on us and on all your people that we may love one another, work for the healing of the earth, and share the good news of Jesus, as we wait for his coming in glory.

For honour and praise belong to you, Father, with Jesus your Son, and the Holy Spirit: one God, forever and ever.

All: **Nowell, Nowell, Nowell, Nowell,
born is the King of Israel.**

The Lord's Prayer

Celebrant: Let us pray together as Jesus taught us.

All: **Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name,
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done, on earth as in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power, and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.**

Celebrant: We break the bread of life, and that life is the Light of the world.

All: **God here among us, light in the midst of us,
bring us to light and life.**

Invitation to Communion

Celebrant: The gifts of God for all the People of God.

People: **Thanks be to God.**
