New Eight-Week Adult Education Class "Every Living Creature: God's Design for Animals" January 16, 23 & 30; February 13 & 20; March 6, 13 & 20 In-person at 10:00 a.m.

Most of us who have had pets intuitively understand that animals are wonderfully noble and have a capacity to love that only can come from God. However, we never hear much in church about animals—why God created them or what God intends for them. The scope of grace is vaster and more creative than we once thought. Bible verses such as Colossians 1:15-20, which speak of God's interest in all things, in fact abound in the Old and New Testament.

Several academic theologians are beginning to think freshly about all living creatures as players in God's plan. This class will draw on their work and set before the participants the biblical evidence that God's intention is to preserve all things, bringing them to perfection and a joyous, harmonious existence. We will consider the nature and destiny of the whole created world.

Faith Focus Weekend / Pastoral Development Seminar Wednesday - Sunday, February 2-6



The Rev. Neddy Astudillo, a Venezuelan eco-theologian and PC(USA) pastor will be our guest speaker for Faith Focus Weekend. Neddy coordinates GreenFaith's Latinx and Latin America Organizing and Training program. Neddy has a Doctor of Ministry in "Greening the Church." In 1998, she co-founded the Angelic Organics Learning Center, a farm-based nonprofit organization, where people connect with food, farming and caring for the earth. Neddy teaches eco-theology at seminaries in the U.S. and Latin-America.

There will be a special intergenerational event on **Saturday**, **February 5**, at 10:00 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall for our church and community. Neddy's presentation on Saturday morning is titled, *Ministering with the Earth: What Is Climate Change and What Can We Do About It?* The environmental and climate crisis challenges us to look at our relationships with nature, understand its root causes, and find our moral and spiritual tools to overcome

the crisis. We will reflect and consider faith-based solutions to the environmental and climate crisis. **The CLEO Institute** based in Miami will also be part of the Saturday presentation.



In addition, several **hands-on art and plant-related activities** will be offered. Following Neddy's presentation a \$10 boxed lunch will be provided. Be sure to sign up for the lunch in advance by calling the church office (941) 955-8119 with your reservations.

Wednesday - Sunday, February 2-6, will be an exciting time of supporting young pastors while also learning together about climate change. It has been a long time since these two important ministries has been able to occur so mark your calendars to include the many ways we all can participate.



Wednesday, February 2, seven guest pastors will arrive on our campus along with the Seminar Leader, Rev. Lori Raible, Pastor of Selwyn Avenue Presbyterian Church in Charlotte, NC. The pastors are from Delaware, Michigan, Minnesota, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. They were originally going to come October 2020 and February 2021, but COVID changed those plans. They have already been meeting together with Lori via Zoom. Sunday morning, Neddy will be preaching at both worship services and the seven pastors will be leading a Sunday School class at 10:00 a.m. talking about their ministries; calls, joys, and challenges.
