A Celebrate! Worship for Every Festival⁺
Service of Holy Communion





Preparation and Planning notes:

The Thanksgiving for Baptismal Waters flows through this service like a river, connecting God's gift of water for all creation and for our personal lives with stories in the Bible in which water is central: Jesus' baptism, our baptism, and the call of life of all who are baptized.

Several preparations will need to be made in advance:

1. *A blue cloth, "flowing" from the base of the baptismal font like a river*
2. *Four pitchers, filled with water, should be placed near the font prior to the service, for pouring into the baptismal font, preceding each of the four major sections of the Thanksgiving for Baptismal Waters*
3. *Green boughs and bowls for each person who will be doing aspersion during the Thanksgiving for Baptismal Waters*



4. *Newsprint or Butcher paper prepared in advance with a large depiction of the "A River Runs Through It" image (see next page and attachment), preferably placed on a table in an accessible area so that each person (of all ages) can easily add their thumbprints.*
5. *Various colors of water-soluble paints in small bowls for making thumbprints*
6. *Wet wipes to clean hands after thumbprints are affixed to the "A River Runs Through It" image*
7. *Trash receptacle for the wet wipes*

ASPERSION: *To encourage full congregational participation, people of all ages should be invited in advance to lead the aspersion. It is recommended that the aspersion is practiced so that worshipers are sprinkled with water, not "soaked."*


- *For each time of aspersion in the liturgy, it is recommended that, if the font is large enough, water is poured from a pitcher into the font.*
- *Next, a small bowl is dipped into the font to be filled with enough water, adequate for aspersion.*
- *If the font is not large enough to accommodate dipping a bowl, it is recommended that water is first poured from the pitcher into the font, and then directly into the bowl.*

Readers: *The First Reading is from the Beginner's Bible. The second reading is from the Easy to Read Version of the Bible. The Gospel Reading is from the New Revised Standard Version Updated Edition (NRSVUE). It would be appropriate to have the first reading shared by a child's voice. It is preferable to have the readers chosen in advance so that the readings can be practiced prior to worship. However,*

readers may also be chosen at the start of the service, if this is part of local tradition and appropriate to a given context.

Music: *The songs provided are suggestions. The hymn numbers are from Evangelical Lutheran Worship. Congregations are encouraged to choose sacred music that reflects the piety of their particular worshiping community. Should musical ensembles or soloists be available, congregations are encouraged to include either intergenerational ensembles or soloists and ensembles that represent a variety of ages and abilities. Service music should reflect the water theme that connects us to the whole of creation.*

Water and Welcome: *Because this service includes aspersion, it will be important to include service notes to that effect, and also in the welcome to inform the worshipers that throughout the service they will be sprinkled with water, in remembrance of and Thanksgiving for Baptismal waters.*

Second Reading

Acts 10:34-43

Peter began to speak: "I really understand now that God does not consider some people to be better than others. He accepts anyone who worships him and does what is right. It is not important what nation they come from. God has spoken to the people of Israel. He sent them the Good News that peace has come through Jesus Christ, the Lord of all people.

"You know what has happened all over Judea. It began in Galilee after John told the people they needed to be baptized. You know about Jesus from Nazareth. God made him the Messiah by giving him the Holy Spirit and power. Jesus went everywhere doing good for people. He healed those who were ruled by the devil, showing that God was with him."

Luke 3:15-17, 21-22

P: The Holy Gospel According to Luke.

Child of God, remember that through water and the Word, your sins are forgiven. The old has passed away, you have been made new in Christ, and you are called to let your light shine for the sake of the Gospel, for the sake of the world.

Please place your tithes and extra offerings in the offering plate as you come forward for Holy Communion.

The service (with or without Holy Communion) continues below.
