

Sent to Serve

Sent to Serve is the organization selected to receive half of the offerings from our NWIM Synodical Women's Organization gathering and convention held August 8-9, 2025 at Lord of Life Lutheran in Kennewick, Washington. They also were the recipient of half of the adult socks we collected as a physical offering.

Sent to Serve is a mission started in the Tri-Cities to serve the unhoused population in the area. The organization owns a trailer with 4 private shower rooms. They park the trailer in various locations twice a month during the late spring through early fall. Kennewick First Lutheran has been hosting the shower trailer once monthly. A grant given to Sent to Serve by Ben Franklin Transit allows them to give out free bus passes to homeless people so they can travel to where the shower trailer is parked. When a homeless person comes to take a shower, he/she also receives a new set of clothing and hygiene items. Free haircuts are offered, and a potluck hot meal is served. At the September 6th event, 80 people were the recipients of a new pair of socks! The rest of the socks will be distributed during the October 4th event.

Sent to Serve also serves hot meals in Kennewick every Sunday. At those events,

volunteers help people with filling out paperwork for social services, wound care, and

pretty much anything else that is needed. Approximately 150 people are served at each of
these Sunday meals.

Recently, Sent to Serve was able to obtain a trailer with only 2 shower rooms. This one is able to be towed with a smaller vehicle and will be able to be parked in smaller locations. Sent to Serve would like to offer a heartfelt thank you to all the ladies who donated socks and/or money to this vital ministry!

This money will be a reimbursement so that we know that each person who is chosen actually goes.
