Homelessness Roundtable

September 11, 2019

Homeless Families and their children have been served by Head Start and Early Head Start local agencies for many years. Our programs are uniquely equipped to serve these families with our comprehensive service model.

The new Head Start Program Performance Standards (HSPPS) released in November 2016 include a provision [§1302.15(c)] allowing Head Start and Early Head Start programs to re-serve one or more enrollment slots (up to 3% of the funded enrollment) for pregnant women and children experiencing homelessness in their service areas for a period of 30 days when a vacancy occurs. This provision complements the aforementioned regulations of the Head Start Act and can serve as one part of a program's broader strategy for serving children and families experiencing homelessness (<https://naehcy.org/early-childhood/>). Furthermore, local program leaders report challenges on reaching and impacting this community in a meaningful manner. Here in Illinois, and across this nation, services to homeless families is complex and requires new innovations, partnerships and resources.

Join us for a Roundtable on Services to Families Experiencing Homelessness, on September 11, 2019!

During this time, we hope to engage with our Regional Office and hear updates on how they are supporting this effort in coordination with the Central Office of Head Start. We are planning for presentations from selected agencies and group discussions to reflect on challenges facing our grantees, delegates, and community partners.

CLASS Observation Training

CLASS Observation Training (Pre-K)



The CLASS (Classroom Assessment Scoring System) is an observational instrument to assess quality in preschool classrooms. The CLASS assesses interactions between children and teachers in three broad domains of classroom quality: Emotional Support, Classroom Organization, and Instructional Support. The Office of Head Start believes that the domains of quality measured by the CLASS remain central to its approach to child development and education and serve as important indicators of the future school readiness of all Head Start children. The two days will focus on CLASS Observation Training with Reliability Assessment offered online.

Who should attend? Are you interested in learning how to observe classrooms using the CLASS? This training will guide you through the CLASS Observation tools and prepare you to become a reliable CLASS Observer in our two-day Pre-K CLASS Observation Training. This training is open to Education Managers, Curriculum Specialists, Master Teachers, and Program Directors in Head Start agencies, school districts, and other early childhood agencies that serve preschool age children. ***Important Note: Attendance is required for both days to be eligible for reliability testing.***

Practice Based Coaching Training Institute PBCTI

The Practice-Based Coaching Training Institute (PBCTI) is an intensive 2-day event intended for coaches implementing the Practice Based Coaching model. During the PBCTI, coaches will learn how to use Practice-Based Coaching to support staff's use of high-quality teaching and home-visiting practices.

Objectives for the PBCTI:

Coaches will be able to:

- Identify the key components of PBC
- Describe the characteristics of collaborative partnerships
- Work with staff to create shared goals and develop action plans for achieving those goals
- Conduct focused observations based on action plans
- Use reflection and feedback to support staff's implementation of the identified goals
- Meet the Head Start Program Performance Standard for implementing a research-based, coordinated coaching strategy by a trained coach



The training content has been expanded to include coaching in center-based, home-based and family child care program options. Discussion will include coaching to fidelity with an emphasis on using research-based teaching practices.

A trauma-informed organization continues to demonstrate a commitment to compassionate and effective practices and organizational reassessments, and it changes to meet the needs of children and families with histories of trauma. Creating a trauma-informed organization is a fluid, ongoing process; it has no completion date but is critical in the work we do for our most vulnerable children and families. Come to this training to begin the process of becoming a trauma-informed organization or to touch-up on your current process. Part One of the good to great “Trauma-Informed Organizations,” training will focus on specific organizational strategies that will help develop a trauma-informed culture in your Head Start agency. The training will provide a broad overview of how to create and implement an institutional framework for trauma-informed services in program delivery and staff development, policies and procedures, administrative practices, and organizational infrastructure. The second part of this training will focus on building a trauma informed workforce. This will focus on organizational activities that foster the development of a trauma-informed workforce, including recruiting, hiring, and retaining trauma-informed staff; providing training on evidence-based and emerging trauma-informed best practices; developing competencies specific to trauma-informed care; addressing ethical considerations; and providing trauma-informed supervision.
