

Hey February! What happened to January? For me January is always a hard month. I am such a kid at heart and enjoy every minute of the holidays. This makes January a letdown. But, WOW, did this January fly by! I have lots to share with you! First, I just came back from Washington DC. As you can guess there is much going on. I had several small meetings with key leaders regarding the increase in minimum wage. The impact on eligibility is huge for us and a key issue for Illinois. To change the federal poverty level will take opening up Head Start for Reauthorization and many believe that this would be a mistake. But what other options do we have? We are hard at work with coming up with other solutions. Other urgent needs addressed was the movement of universal prekindergarten and childcare. How does Head Start fit within the movement? Governor Pritzker just announced he is supporting “universal home visiting.” How will Head Start fit in? The meeting with the Office of Head Start was interesting. Several key things to note include: OHS is working with the National Superintendent Association and the National Elementary Principal Association and has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with both Associations; the new announcement from the Secretary of HHS on duration stating that 45% of Head Start enrollment must meet the 1020 hours by 2021; the final rules for DRS are projected to come out in late summer, and last but not least, a Program Instructions on Quality Improvement dollars will be coming out soon; the projection shared was that the dollars will be based on the number of children you are serving, \$250 for a Head Start slot and \$350 for EHS.

We've been working with the Illinois Office of Early Childhood Development on Parent Cafes. This has been exciting work with developing Parent Leaders who lead and facilitate Parent Café's for parents. Key topics have been around attendance and suspension and expulsion.
