Recognizing the vital role rural hospitals play in the health of our communities and our state, the Alabama Legislature recently approved a new initiative: Alabama's Rural Hospital Investment Program. This program is designed to strengthen the financial stability of rural hospitals like ours by encouraging private donations from individuals and businesses—with the added benefit of a state tax credit.

Invest in Alabama's Rural Hospitals The Rural Hospital Investment Program allows taxpayers to donate directly to eligible rural hospitals and receive a dollar-for-dollar state tax credit. This credit can be applied not only against income taxes but also insurance premium taxes, utility taxes, and excise taxes, providing flexibility for both individuals and businesses. These funds will help support hospitals maintain the critical services that keep our community healthy. Starting January 1, 2026, the program will allow up to \$20 million in total tax-credit-eligible donations across the state for the year.

Keeping Care Close to Home

- Individuals can donate up to \$15,000.
- Married couples filing jointly can give up to \$30,000.
- LLCs, S corporations, and partnerships can contribute up to \$450,000.
- Corporations can give up to \$500,000.
