Miami-Dade Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces

Schedule your field trips in advance as dates fill up quickly. When you call to reserve a program, a registration form will be created and either emailed or faxed to you for your signature. Your date will only be reserved and guaranteed once we have received a completed and signed registration form in our office. A confirmation packet will be sent to your facility after receiving a registration form, it will include your confirmed date and for all aquatic programs, a swim test form and safety waivers. Please arrive on time to ensure your group experiences the complete program or notify us if you will be delayed. If we are not informed of your delay, your program will still end at the scheduled end time.

Teachers, Camp Counselors and Chaperones

Land-based Adventure Programs:

Requirements: At least one adult chaperone for every fifteen participants (1:15). There is no charge for teachers or the required number of chaperones. Adults over the required number of chaperones will be charged the program fee.

Aquatic Adventure Programs:

Requirements At least one adult chaperone for every six participants (1:6). There is no charge for the required number of chaperones. Chaperones must participate in the aquatic program so please **dress accordingly**.

Cancellation Policy

Field Trip program sites may cancel programs and activities when weather or other circumstances beyond our control make it necessary. Every attempt will be made to reschedule your field trip date. No-shows or cancellations made less than 24 hours prior to the field trip must be paid in full. Programs are conducted rain or shine; however, they will be postponed at the first sign of lightning. A 50% cancellation fee will be charged for cancellations made less than one week prior to trip. No-shows will be charged 100% of trip total. ALL CANCELLATIONS NEED TO BE EMAILED DIRECTLY TO THE PROGRAM SITE.

Payment

Cash, check, credit card or journal entry (JE) payments are accepted. For journal entry (JE) payments, please make sure the field trip leader/counselor brings the appropriate index code or have your facility call the appropriate program site with the index code prior to your field trip date.

Important Conditions

It is absolutely necessary for participants to inform the trip leader of any medical conditions that may require attention during the program. For **Aquatic Programs**, Miami-Dade County regulations require lifejackets to be worn at all times by all participants (this includes participating counselors). For each participant, safety waivers and swim test forms must be turned in to the park naturalist upon arrival. All participants are required to have passed a swim test conducted by a lifeguard prior to the field trip date. Naturalist guides must be informed of any non-swimmers, as these students will not be allowed to participate in the water-based program. Programs that involve snorkeling sometimes experience seasonal waves of jellyfish and man-o-war. We will not snorkel if the park lifeguards determine that high numbers of these venomous creatures make it unsafe. Anyone with hyper-allergic reactions to bites or stings should not go in the water during these periods.

Individuals with Special Needs

Park staff will make every effort to meet your group's program needs. Please inform the park staff of any special needs or considerations when making a reservation for your program. When possible please give field trip site 36-hour notice of any special requirements so that field trip sites can make appropriate arrangements to meet your needs.

Required Attire

Participants will be outside, so have them dress appropriately. Closed-toed shoes such as aqua socks or old sneakers and sun protection and bug repellent are required. Play clothes are recommended, because the children may get dirty during some of the activities. Water bottles are strongly recommended. For aquatic activities, please make sure each participant brings a bathing suit, towel, closed-toed shoes (that can get wet). Participants and chaperones will not be allowed to participate in any activity if wearing flip-flops or other open-toed shoes.



Lunch

Picnic tables will be provided for your group. Participants must bring their own lunch. We recommend that lunches be packed in a way that the chaperones or individual participants can easily transport them to the assigned lunch area. Feeding of animals is strictly prohibited. Please help keep our park clean and litter free for other visitors and wildlife.

Park Manners

Loud noises keep animals in hiding and reduce your chances of seeing them. Therefore, be kind to the animals and plants at the park. Harassing wildlife is against the law and can harm the animals. Feeding the animals encourages them to be dependent on humans, which leads to increased chances of humans being bitten by that animal. Plants require their leaves to make food and their flowers to produce seeds so please do not pick the leaves, flowers, or bark of the plants. Please make sure this information is relayed to all participants and trip supervisors.

Virtual Offerings

Each park site is responsible for providing the necessary audio & visual needs for the deliver of a virtual program. Each unit providing the virtual offering is responsible to confirm the virtual link at least 48-hours of the schedule virtual offering (ZOOM, TEAMS, other).

COVID CAPACITY & OFFERINGS:

Each site and activity may have approved COVID capacity & offerings at the designated Sites/Park/Nature Center. Please contact the program of interest to determine COVID approved capacity & offerings. This also includes outreaches to the park sites following CDC guidelines of facial covering, social distancing from presenter and sanitations. All COVID approved activities by PROS unit provider must be arranged by each requesting park.

Naturalists will provide a safety briefing before the beginning of the programs. Chaperones, not park naturalists, are responsible for the behavior, discipline, and safety of their group. Please be observant and safety conscious to prevent accidents. Please make sure that this information is relayed to all participants and trip supervisors. If naturalists believe the behavior of participants is making the scheduled activity unsafe, the naturalists reserve the right to stop the activity until the group's behavior has improved. If the group's behavior does not improve, naturalists reserve the right to cancel the scheduled activity.

On-Site Water-Based Adventures:

Kayak Workshop

There is simply no better way to experience the clear waters of Key Biscayne and its rich marine life than from the seat of an ocean kayak. Join our naturalists as they teach your group the basic skills required for kayaking. Participants will get an opportunity to practice their new kayak skills in the shallow seagrass beds off Crandon Park. Chaperones are required to participate (1:6 ratio). Lead chaperone must bring a completed swim test log. Closed-toed shoes are required for participants and chaperones. Shoes WILL get wet. MUST pass swim test and bring proof to participate.

Duration of program: 2 hours, including 30-minute lunch break at provided park shelter (no additional fee).

Program Fee: \$10 per participant (County Parks) / \$15 other organizations, minimum fee \$150/ session

Program Details: Maximum 48 participants. Ages 9+. 12 participants on the water at a time. If you bring a group larger than 12, please divide your groups accordingly, plan to provide activities for those waiting their turn, and plan on extending your field trip time at the park. Program meets at the Crandon Park Visitor and Nature Center located at Crandon Park North Beach.

Sea to Sand Adventure

Explore Crandon Park's abundant seagrass beds and thriving dunes. Participants will learn about two of South Florida's unique ecosystems, their components and what kind of animals/plants live within them. Our naturalists will hunt for sea life in the seagrass beds and then take students to the dunes to ID dune plants. Lead chaperone must bring a completed swim test log. Closed-toed shoes are required for participants and chaperones. Chaperones are required to participate (1:6 ratio). Lead chaperone must bring a completed swim test log. Closed-toed shoes are required for participants and chaperones. Shoes WILL get wet. MUST pass swim test and bring proof to participate.

Duration of program: 2 hours, including 30-minute lunch break at provided park shelter (No additional fee).

Program Fee: \$10 per participant (County Parks) / \$15 other organizations, minimum \$150/session

Program Details: Maximum: 48 participants Ages: 9+. 12 participants on the water at a time. If you bring a group larger than 12, please divide your groups accordingly, plan to provide activities for those waiting their turn, and plan on extending your field trip time at the park. Program meets at the Crandon Park Visitor and Nature Center located at Crandon Park North Beach.

On-Site Land-Based Adventures

Sea Turtle Adventure

Join one of our knowledgeable naturalists as we shell-ebrate sea turtles! Learn more about the biology of these ancient animals, where they are found, what they eat, and why they come to our beaches every summer. Participants will get the chance to observe sea turtle artifacts such as shells, skulls, and the different items that they eat before heading down to the beach to see a marked sea turtle nest and to explore the ecosystems where sea turtles nest and forage.

Duration of program: 2 hours, including 30-minute lunch break at provided park shelter (No additional fee).

Program Fee: \$7 per participant or a flat rate of \$150 for groups of 21 or less.

Program Details: Maximum 40 participants. Ages: 6+. If you bring a group larger than 10, please divide your group accordingly, plan to provide activities for those waiting their turn, and plan on extending your field trip time at the park. Program meets at the Crandon Park Visitor and Nature Center located at Crandon Park North Beach.



Bear Cut Preserve Coastal Walk

Join us on a naturalist-guided tour through a rare remnant of Miami's remaining maritime hammock, dune habitat and mangrove forest. Learn how plants and animals adapt and interact with each other in this hostile, yet fascinating coastal marine environment. Please bring plenty of drinking water and comfortable walking/hiking shoes.

Duration of program: 2 hours, including 30-minute lunch break at provided park shelter (No additional fee).

Program Fee: \$7 per participant, or a flat rate of \$150 for groups of 21 or less.

Program Details: Maximum 40 participants. Ages 6+. If you bring a group larger than 10, please divide your group accordingly, plan to provide activities for those waiting their turn, and plan on extending your field trip time at the park. Program meets at the Crandon Park Visitor and Nature Center located at Crandon Park North Beach.



Birds of Crandon Park

Fly, don't walk to Crandon Adventure's Bird Walk, where we search for the birds that reside in Crandon Park. Several species utilize the beach at different times of year; learn the behavior, calls, and field marks used to identify them. Program will include a presentation to familiarize participants with common species followed by a walk along Crandon Beach where participants will work in groups to identify species encountered. Join us in learning about some of our feathered friends.

Duration of program: 2 hours, including 30-minute lunch break at provided park shelter (No additional fee).

Program Fee: \$7 per participant, or a flat rate of \$150 for groups of 21 or less.

Program details: Maximum: 40 participants. Ages 6+. If you bring a group larger than 10, please divide your group accordingly, plan to provide activities for those waiting their turn, and plan on extending your field trip time at the park. Program meets at the Crandon Gardens located at Crandon Park South Beach.

Crandon Wilderness Adventure

If you're looking for a day of fun, this program is perfect for your group! Students can observe local wildlife such as fish, reptiles and numerous species of birds through Crandon Park. The students will also be led on a nature walk through the historic Crandon Gardens, the site of Miami's first zoo, and participate in wildlife-themed games.

Duration of program: 2 hours, including 30-minute lunch break at provided park shelter (No additional fee).

Program Fee: \$7 per participant, or a flat rate of \$150 for groups of 21 or less.

Program details: Maximum: 40 participants. Ages 6+. If you bring a group larger than 10, please divide your group accordingly, plan to provide activities for those waiting their turn, and plan on extending your field trip time at the park. Outreach Programs

Touch the Bay

Sea stars, conchs and sea urchins! Oh my! Explore the sea grass ecosystem through a presentation and a hands-on touch tank activity featuring some of the amazing critters found there. Learn about and get up close to a few of the commonly found creatures as well as the different types of sea grass.

Duration of presentation: 1 hour

Program Fee: \$7 per participant, or a flat rate of \$150 for groups of 21 or less

Program Details: Maximum: 40 participants per presentation. Ages 6+. If your group is larger than 10, please divide your group accordingly and plan on an hour presentation for each group.

Coastal Conservation and Resiliency

Participants will explore how various shorelines influence coastal erosion and the surrounding habitat. This lesson introduces students to nature's infrastructure with visual and tangible aids—coral reefs, mangroves, and maritime forests—as well as with society's needs to reduce risk and increase community resilience.

Duration of presentation: 1 hour

Program Fee: \$7 per participant, or a flat rate of \$150 for groups of 21 or less

Program Details: Maximum: 40 participants per presentation. Ages 6+. If your group is larger than 10, please divide your group accordingly and plan on an hour presentation for each group.

Sea Turtle & Ocean Outreach

Explore the wonders of some of the marvelous creatures that visit our South Florida beaches. Learn more about these animals, what they eat, why they come to our shores, and where they are found through a presentation conducted by one of our knowledgeable naturalists at your location. Have a chance to touch various animal artifacts such as shells, skulls, and skeletons as well as some of the different things they eat (sponges, corals, etc.).

Duration of presentation: 1 hour

Program Fee: \$7 per participant, or a flat rate of \$150 for groups of 21 or less

Program Details: Maximum: 40 participants per presentation. Ages 6+. If your group is larger than 10, please divide your group accordingly and plan on an hour presentation for each group.

Virtual Programs

A Day On The Bay

Spend a beautiful day on Biscayne Bay, virtually! Join us in exploring the largest estuary on the coast of southeast Florida and all the wonders that live within with a virtual touch tank presentation. Our naturalists will discuss the various ecosystems in the Bay while sharing underwater, aerial, and surface footage of these unique underwater environments. Our most important water source, the Biscayne Aquifer, how it functions and is replenished, and the threats facing it will also be discussed in this virtual adventure.

Program Details: Suggested participant size: 40 participants per presentation. Ages 6+. Presentation hosted via Zoom.

What's Under The Bed?

Get up close and personal with the seagrass beds of Crandon Park with our underwater drone footage! Seven species of seagrass are found in Florida, with the most common being turtle grass, manatee grass, and shoal grass. Glide along the beds of seagrass found at Crandon Park as we discuss the ecological services these underwater forest provide and search for marinelife that lives underneath!

Virtual Presentation: 1 hour

Program Fee: \$7 per participant, or a flat rate of \$150 for groups of 21 or less

Program Details: Suggested participant size: 40 participants per presentation. Ages 6+. Presentation hosted via Zoom.

Coastal Conservation and Resiliency

Our virtual version of the Coastal Conservation and Resiliency program covers all of South Florida's protected ecosystems with prerecorded footage off of Crandon Park. First watch clips of lush seagrass as we discuss their function, then continue on as we delve deep into the tangles of the red mangrove roots and uncover their mystery. Finally finish up back on land exploring our dunes.

Birding 101

Do you know what kind of bird that is? What is that little brown one that is always at your bird feeder? What birds migrate to south Florida for the winter? Join a Miami EcoAdventures naturalist on a hike of our natural areas where we will teach you how to spot and identify native and exotic birds that call Miami their home. Program focuses on avian biology, human impact on birds and the historical significance of bird conservation in Florida

Outdoor Skills

Do you know what to do if something goes awry on your next outdoor excursion? Learn the ancient skill of survival – shelter, water, fire, food. Get back to nature and reflect on the fundamentals of survival. Knowing the basics of outdoorsmanship is essential for a fun and safe camping experience. You will also get to try out these skills by setting up a mock campsite in our field.

Onsite & Outreach Programs

Go with the Flow (Land - Onsite or outreach)

Despite being less than 3% of water on Earth, freshwater is essential for nearly all life. Learn its importance in our nearby ecosystems, such as the Everglades and our canal systems. Through games and discussion, participants will gain species identification skills of local fish, and begin to understand the importance of clean and accessible freshwater for all living things.



Scales and Tails (Land - Onsite or outreach) Learn about some common native and nonnative reptiles found here in south Florida, as well as how to identify, with a chance to meet some hands-on! These unique ectotherms (meaning "cold blooded") are often misunderstood, but are resilient animals that play a big role in the local ecosystem. After discussion and an interactive program featuring live animals, participate in a scavenger hunt/nature walk to find and identify reptiles in the park.

Archery (Land - Onsite only)

Learn the history of archery as a sport and tool for survival in Introduction to Archery. You will also learn how to wield a bow and arrow with proper technique. Then, take some practice shots at a target with instruction from staff. **Ages 9+ only; maximum number of participants per program is 24**

Program Fee: \$7 per person, OR flat rate fee of \$150 for groups of 21 or less.

Outreach Programs: 1 hour; Maximum 60 participants


Tequesta Adventure

Choose a program from Group 1 <u>and</u> a tour from Group 2. The cost is \$10 per participant (Group minimum is 20). Our programs run from 10 am – 1 pm. This can be adjusted to meet timing requirements.

Programs run rain or shine. Please be aware that no-shows or cancellations made less than 48 hours prior to the field trip will require full payment of the original booking number. Changes to booking numbers must be made 48 hours in advance or will result in full payment of the original booking number.

Group 1 Programs

Archaeology Excavation Simulation

Participants will learn about the people and cultures that existed in South Florida before modern development. They will utilize critical thinking skills and hands-on discovery learning methods to uncover real artifacts and their historic uses. Groups will apply archaeological survey methods to discover bones, pottery, and artifacts from a culture that once thrived thousands of years ago.

Duration of program: 1 hour

Program details: Maximum 150 participants. Ages: 6+.

Marine Critter Dissection

Participants will become professional ichthyologists, learning about the unique characteristics of various marine animals as well as their anatomy and physiology. After an introduction, they will be led in groups through a step-by-step dissection of a squid or fish allowing them to get a hands-on understanding of both the external and internal anatomy of these important marine animals.

Duration of program: 1 hour

Program details: Maximum 150 participants. Ages: 6+.

Rocket Launch

Participants will learn about the scientific method. Utilizing film canisters and other provided materials students will develop their very own rocket. With the scientific method they will come up with their own hypothesis on which design for their rocket will launch the highest. They will then launch their rockets to see if their hypothesis are correct. After each launch they will go back to the drawing board to make improvements and see who can get their rocket to launch the highest.

Duration of program: 1 hour

Catching Critters

Participants wade out knee deep into Biscayne Bay to explore the aquatic life of our seagrass communities, using discovery-based learning methods and nets to catch fish, shrimp and crabs (along with anything else that shows up!). Staff identifies the different species that are caught, and give participants a chance to touch any animals that are safe to handle. Participants will get wet during this and must wear closed toed shoes

Group 2 Programs

Historic House Tour

Participants will take a tour of the Deering Estate's historic buildings, including the Stone House and the Richmond Cottage, to find out how the Estate has changed hands, developed and grown since the first settlers built their houses here in South Dade.

Marine Debris Hike

Participants will be given a Citizen Science Worksheet and trash bags while being guided into the natural areas of the Estate. There they will study and collect the litter found throughout the park. Participants will classify what the litter is made out of and how long it will take to decompose. This data will be shared with the Ocean Conservancy as part of a Citizen Science partnership to improve understanding of marine pollution. Closed toed shoes required.

Duration of program: 1 hour

Program details: Maximum 150 participants. Ages: 9+.

Animal Encounter

Participants will be introduced to some of the local wild life we have here at the Estate. They also will get to see some of the different invasive species we find in South Florida. Students will learn about these animals while having the opportunity to hold them, touch them, and take pictures with them. Some of our animals include a red tail boa, king snake, rat snake, scorpion, lionfish, and more.

Duration of program: 1 hour

Program details: Maximum 150 participants. Ages: 6+.

Outreach Programs

We offer a 2 hour outreach program. The cost is \$10 per participant where they will be able to do two activities out of the following: Marine Critter Dissection, Rocket Launch, and Animal Encounter. There is a minimum of 20 participants and a max of 150.

- All Campers will need to remain on bus/van until the Trip Supervisor and Staff have checked in and received direction from Camp OB Instructors.
- The Trip Supervisor will be required to sign the registration form stating the number of participants and method of payment.
- The Trip Supervisor will either pay by exact change for the field trip or supply the index code for a Journal Entry.

- During the rainy season the caves can become slippery, all Campers need to wear closed toe and rubber sole shoes.
