Dear Neighbors,

Every month I write this message in order to keep you updated on events, issues, and important information that affects our community. Next month, we'll all be making decisions on our ballots and no matter how you vote, please vote. It's our privilege and duty as benefactors of our constitution.

Two measures on the November ballot that can affect San Jose are Measure V and Measure T.

Measure V is an affordable housing measure that calls for the issuance of up to \$450 million in General Obligation Bonds for the acquisition, construction and completion of affordable housing in the City of San Jose. For a full, impartial description click [here](#). To read the tax rate statement to understand the estimates of the annual average tax rate and the highest estimated tax rate, click [here](#). It's important to note that the tax rate is based on the assessed value of a property, not the property's market value.

Measure T is a \$650 million General Obligation bond for use in the areas of disaster preparedness, public safety, and infrastructure. The measure requires two-thirds approval from electors. Again, the tax rate is based on the assessed value of a property, not the property's market value.
