


An Introduction from Fr. Ed Kelaher, Rector

Acts 4:31

And when they had prayed, the place where they had gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak the word of God with boldness.

1. We pray.
2. The power of God shakes the world around us.
3. We are FILLED with the Holy Spirit.
4. We speak the Word of God with boldness.

It all seems simple and clear enough. Just do what the Apostles did and the Holy Spirit will come in power, glory, and love to FILL us to speak the good news of the Gospel to the world. And yes, as the prophets Jerry Lee Lewis and Little Richard proclaimed long ago, there also will be a Whole Lotta Shakin' Going On! It may be the shaking part that is the most fun of all for me.

We have been inspired and energized to make a great gift to our Lord God by a full day of prayer. We kneel before Him to tell Him how much we love Him, how grateful we are for all His blessings, and how much we desire to be with Him carrying out the Gospel of Jesus. The message of the Good News of forgiveness and eternal life in Christ is absolutely urgent and it is always so. The cries of the poorest and most afflicted among us depend upon our true sacrifices, love, and obedience as we seek God's grace to serve mightily.

Jesus taught us at His Ascension that we can do nothing without the Helper sent to us at Pentecost - the Holy Spirit of God, the Third Person of the Trinity. An urgent mission always requires the greatest resource possible and for us that is the same Spirit. All Saints Church calls upon the Holy Spirit to make us a **Praying Church** and not merely a church that prays. Such prayerfulness is vital and essential if we are to be FILLED with the Holy Spirit and not simply be receiving the Holy Spirit.

I keep capitalizing the word FILLED to make great emphasis of what we seek most. All Saints needs each believer among us to be FILLED with the Holy Spirit so that we might evermore sacrifice and serve in Jesus' holy Name, be protected against all that rails against God and His people, be compassionate like Jesus, and give of our time, talents, and treasure in a season of practical impairment and shortages among all churches. We need help beyond any human supply. We need for the entire world to be shaken. We need the Holy Spirit of God to come and embolden us.

An old country preacher once said that his sermon preparation involved delivering his sermon over and over to an oak tree in the woods. When the tree finally moved, the sermon was ready! Likewise, we are to pray over and over until the building around us is shaken. And when that happens, the Body of Christ is ready! God bless you for taking up this holy, holy ministry. Expect glory to come of your prayers and you will not be disappointed.

How to Use This Prayer Guide

This prayer guide is designed to aid and inspire you as you pray for God's provision. We pray that God would use it to direct your heart, soul, mind, and strength on how to pray both specifically and generally for our parish so that the good work that God has already begun here might continue unimpeded.


The first section prepares you before you enter the good and hard work of prayer. It lays out what we as the clergy, staff, vestry, and leaders see as walls that may prevent our ministry from continuing with the energy, depth, and breadth that we have seen in recent years. Please read this before you begin your prayer journey.

The remaining sections take you through 7 ministry areas so that your thoughts and prayers might focus on God's provision for each ministry area specifically. Each section includes Scriptures to meditate on, a Bible Lesson and Psalm, People and Accomplishment to pray and be thankful for, and specific prayers from the *Book of Common Prayer* or written by the leaders who compiled this book.

This Day of Prayer is designed to guide you through a walk around the church building. Thus, each ministry area is associated with a particular stop outside the church building. You can use the map on this page to guide you around the building to each stop, beginning at the playground and circling clockwise around the grounds. Of course, if you are praying at home, you might want to visualize and ponder these stops as you pray for our ministries.

I also want to thank Kathleen Dillon, Phoebe Miles, Jennifer Sirangelo, and Dan Buckingham for their hard work in creating this prayer guide, organizing the Day of Prayer, and blessing our parish.

Finally, may God bless you for your prayers, devotion, love, and support, not just of All Saints Church but her people, mission partners, and community. May God use this time to bless our parish and grow His eternal Kingdom in our hearts, neighborhoods, country, and around the world. Amen.



Preparation for Prayer

Breaking Down the Obstacles before All Saints Church

After 40 years in the wilderness, the Israelites, God's chosen people, stand poised to enter the Promised Land. Moses summoned all Israel and said (Deuteronomy 5:1–3):

Israel, listen to the statutes and ordinances I am proclaiming as you hear them today. Learn and follow them carefully. The Lord our God made a covenant with us at Horeb. He did not make this covenant with our ancestors, but with all of us who are alive here today.

After Moses' death, Joshua leads the Israelites to cross the Jordan River, stepping into the promised land. The first obstacle before them was Jericho. Jericho's wall presented an overwhelming challenge to the army. Yet God already secured the outcome before them. But the army still had to do its part. Thus, we read (Joshua 5:13–6:5).

Then the Lord said to Joshua, "See, I have delivered Jericho into your hands, along with its king and its fighting men. March around the city once with all the armed men. Do this for six days. Have seven priests carry trumpets of rams' horns in front of the ark. On the seventh day, march around the city seven times, with the priests blowing the trumpets. When you hear them sound a long blast on the trumpets, have the whole army give a loud shout; then the wall of the city will collapse and the army will go up, everyone straight in."

Like Israel, the parishioners of All Saints Church gather weekly to hear the New Covenant God has made with us, His people. We are to be Kingdom people and a Kingdom church, loving God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength, and loving our neighbors as ourselves.

God has blessed us abundantly: a beautiful building, faithful clergy, and people who seek after Him. He has already secured our outcome, but we still have to do our part. The obstacle that stands before us is an invisible wall of a financial gap. We are here to pray that God would tear down this wall!

As we pray today for God's provision, we are reminded of our history and the journey still ahead. We hear God's Word and write it upon our heart. We stand in turbulent times seeking to reenter our Church and gather together once again as a full community in-person, and we live with hope and love together.

There are no walls, visible or invisible, that God cannot tear down.

Opening Prayer

Lord, meet us where we are today, allow your Word to transform our hearts, allow us to see your vision of ASC: ourselves; our immediate community; and our city, nation, and world. Open our hearts to all you have called us to be and do. And provide for us so that we can continue the good work you have given us to do. All for the sake of your Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ. *Amen.*

Come into his presence with singing!





- Provided services for weddings, funerals, and baptisms following health and safety protocols




Prayers


