2021 Klondike Derby – A Self-Serve Event

WHAT is the 2021 Klondike Derby?

Cub Scout Trail: Cub Scouts learn about the 1898 Klondike Gold Rush while having fun and playing games! The Cub Scout Trail is intended for Lions, Tigers, Wolves, Bears, and first-year Webelos (Webelos dens have the option to attend the Scout Trail). Unlike previous years, the 2021 Klondike Derby will not be conducted at a local park with a large number of attendees. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, a Cub Scout den is encouraged to conduct the Klondike Derby at a local venue using resources, references, and ideas provided by the organizers of the Cub Scout Trail. The Dens can conduct their event over a single day or over multiple meetings. Den leaders must follow all BSA guidance on meetings to minimize the risk of COVID-19.

Scout Trail: The Scout Trail is intended for Webelos Scouts, Arrow of Light (AOL) dens, and Scouts below the rank of First Class. The Scout trail allows dens to learn and demonstrate skills they will need in Scouting, including skills required for the rank of First Class Scout. Unlike previous years, the 2021 Klondike Derby will not be conducted at a local park with large numbers of attendees. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, Webelos and AOL dens are encouraged to conduct the Klondike Derby at a local venue where they can learn and demonstrate Scouting skills using resources and references provided by the organizers of the Scout Trail. Local Scout Troops will be available to instruct the Den Leader on Scout skills, which the Den Leader will pass along to their den. The Den can conduct their event over a single day or over multiple meetings. Den leaders must follow all BSA guidance on meetings to minimize the risk of COVID-19.

SCOUTBOOK UPDATE

Scoutbook went through a domain name change recently. It is now <https://scoutbook.scouting.org>. Leaders may have to clear their cache and cookie settings in order to log in under the new domain. To clear your cache and cookie settings please follow the steps below depending on the browser you use.

For Chrome :
To clear a Single Cookie :
1. Click on 3 dots on top right of browser
2. Choose Settings
3. In Privacy and Security, select Cookies and other site data
4. Click See All Cookies
5. Search cookies for Scoutbook
6. Click on trashcan next to scoutbook.scouting.org

To clear cache:
1. Click on 3 dots on top right of browser
2. Choose Settings
3. In Privacy and Security, click clear browsing data
4. Click all time
5. Click cached images and files
6. Clear data

For Microsoft Edge :
There is no way to clear an individual cookie, but you can clear all cookies.
To clear Cache and all cookies:
1. Click on 3 dots on top right of browser
2. Choose Settings
3. In Privacy, select search and services
4. In Clear browsing data, click Choose what to clear
5. Click Time range - all time
6. Check cached images and files, and check cookies
7. Click clear now

For Firefox To clear a Single Cookie:
1. Click the hamburger (3 horizontal lines on top right of browser)
2. Click Options
3. Select Privacy and Security
4. In Cookies and Site Data, click manage data
5. Type Scoutbook
6. Click on scoutbook.scouting.org cookie to remove
7. Click Remove Selected
8. Save changes

To clear cache:
1. Click the hamburger (3 horizontal lines on top right of browser)
2. Click Options
3. Select Privacy and Security
4. In Cookies and Site Data, click Clear Data
5. Have only cache box checked
6. Click clear
