



BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING MINUTES Saturday, May 15, 2021 10:30 am Brandon Fradd Theatre, Whyte Hall

The meeting was called to order by Henry Robin at 10:34 am.

Ed Schulhafer motioned to approve the April meeting minutes. Jim Vandernoth seconded, and the motion carried.

220 Bay Walk

- The tenant has vacated the property
- The property was listed at \$599,000; it is in contract for \$550,000
- Bob Howard dropped his commission from 6% to 5%

AIDS Memorial

- The preferred site is 581 Coast Guard Walk, an empty lot on the ocean
 - The site is centrally located to the Pines and Cherry Grove communities
 - The site is owned by Fire Island National Seashore and use of the property is dependent upon Congressional approval
- The Task Force will hold a community forum on May 29 at Whyte Hall from 10:30-11:30 am

Fire Island Boulevard

- The Boulevard grading started last Monday
 - The Town of Brookhaven hired a third party to do the work

- The License Agreement to manage the Boulevard from Sandy to Sail must be modified to accommodate contractors who store propane and gasoline; after that, it will be finalized
- The new rules for the Boulevard will be rolled out at a Town Hall on June 8 and enforcement will begin on July 1
- The Task Force is surveying additional areas for parking

Committee on Black Equality (COBE)

- COBE facilitated unconscious bias training at Whyte Hall on April 25
- A panel will take place on June 20 in celebration of Juneteenth weekend

Community Cleanups

- The community cleanup of May 8 was a great success (the board thanked Karen McCutcheon); the cleanup days are very popular
- A second community cleanup, for landscaping material, will take place this afternoon

Covid Vaccinations

Northwell will be offering J&J vaccines in the Grove during Memorial Day weekend

Garbage

- There are several problems with Brownie: garbage is not picked up on pickup days; there is a higher volume of garbage compared to previous years (45 tons in April 2019 vs. 124 tons in April 2021); Brownie cannot get its equipment off the freight dock in a timely way; Brownie is doing private work on regular trash days
 - The TOB Waste Management Department, Fire Island Ferries, Brownie, Coastline and Councilman Neil Foley are working on the problem; meetings took place on April 5 and 29
 - Brownie is bringing out a trash compactor to help the situation
- Twenty dumpsters will be included in the new contract and the landing fee will increase by \$10,000

Harbor

- Some repairs are needed, including the wagon rack and nighttime lighting; the repairs will be done by FIPPOA staff
- The board approved \$500 to plant an additional tree

Internet Task Force

Verizon installation is ahead of schedule

Litigation

- FIPPOA won on a summary judgement in the Roncalli case, and the settlement hearing will take place on July 12
 - Eric von Kurststeiner is appealing

• FIPPOA has been named in a lawsuit filed by someone hurt on Don Kohlhepp's boat in the harbor; the matter has been turned over to Roger Kluge, FIPPOA's insurance agent

Membership

- The current membership numbers are down 18% from the same period in 2019 and 24% from 2020
- The billing issue that occurred in January has been solved; almost everyone has been moved over to the new platform to increase efficiency
- Wagon stickers were mailed to current members on May 1
- The Thank You Stanchion in the harbor will be updated by Memorial Day
- A suggestion was made to add a membership banner on the website

Pines Party

- The Pines Party Committee is hopeful that a party will occur this year
- The Town of Brookhaven is getting ready to accept permit applications
- The Committee is anticipating that it will start promoting the party on June 1

Quality of Life Task Force

SAGE Award – FIPPOA Proclamation

• Henry Robin will deliver a proclamation at the SAGE event to thank essential workers

<u>Sandbook</u>

- The Sandbook, originally published three years ago, has been updated as a digital version
- The digital flipbook is on fippoa.org and it is interactive

Seashore Defense Fund

- The SDF has raised \$5,000 has been raised this year through an option when people renew their memberships (compared to \$4,500 in 2020)
- The Pines Liquor Shop is continuing the sale of rum, with a portion of sales going to the SDF
- The SDF-sponsored beach bins will be reinstalled on the beach this week and garbage pickup will begin Memorial Day weekend

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>

The board approved \$7,850 to replace the HVAC unit in the FIPPOA office

Wagon Rack

 Wagons without 2021 wagon stickers will be tagged next Tuesday and moved to Whyte Hall on June 19

Website & Branding

- FIPPOA will send out an appeal for designers of the new website and rebranding; a selection made by the middle of July
 - The interim site was redesigned by Chris Mai

Whyte Hall Repairs

• PCC had an extensive list of repairs; almost all repairs were made in the doctor's apartment in time for its opening
