Weekly Construction Project Update

As the changes required by the County are winding down and in preparation for discussion with lenders about a new mortgage for the project, we received an updated cost estimate on the interior building renovations. As noted in the December council minutes, those estimated costs have increased by approximately \$463K from the original ballpark estimate we obtained several years ago. The reasons behind this change are increased materials and labor costs, significant delays with getting approval from the county, and high demand for contractors causing bids to be less competitive. The project team has gone back to review where any scope changes could be made, and these did not produce any significant savings. This means the total project cost estimates have changed from \$2.7M to \$3.2M. This all will be discussed more at the upcoming Congregational Annual Meeting to be held on Feb. 9 at 12 noon.

Bruce Onobrakpeya: The Mask and the Cross

Nigerian sculptor and printmaker Bruce Onobrakpeya began creating works depicting Christian iconography in 1966, when Catholic priests petitioned the artist to interpret the Passion of Christ. The resulting body of work is titled *Fourteen Stations of the Cross*. *Bruce Onobrakpeya: The Mask and the Cross* showcases the earliest of these commissions, from the late 1960s, on display through January 21 at the Smithsonian National Museum of African Art, 950 Independence Ave., SW, Washington, DC.
