MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KESSINGER

JULY OF 2022

t is summer and time to make plans for the fall and winter. Below are some of the things that Pastor Josh and I are working on to help us live out our mission. We hope by the fall that most (if not all) of our members will feel comfortable returning to in-person worship. With an increase in activities we will also need an increase in the number of people who volunteer and/or participate. It is an exciting time to be the church.

God's Work - Our Hands

God's Work – Our Hands is an ELCA initiative that offers congregations an opportunity to celebrate who we are as the church with a day of service. We have held this event in years past and we are pleased to put it back on our schedule. This year it will be held on Sunday, September 11, after the 11 am service. Lunch will be provided, and the service projects will highlight some of the work of Lutheran World Relief. In worship on that Sunday we will sing a hymn that was written by Wayne Wold, a professor and chair of the music department at Hood College in Frederick, Maryland. It is called God's Work – Our Hands and uses a familiar tune with new words to highlight the purpose of the day.

Adult Catechism

In the fall we will offer an *Adult Catechism* class for our new members and for any of us who would like to be refreshed in the basic teachings of the Lutheran Church. When we confirm our young people we encourage them to continue in their studies. As adults we still have much to learn and we look forward to this opportunity to use our life experiences to understand better what we were taught when we were younger. It may also be true that some of us never went through Confirmation class so these sessions will be taught to accommodate all levels.

Sacred Ground

Sacred Ground is a curriculum that was developed by the Episcopal church that is offered for free to any faith-based organization. It is a film-based dialogue series on Race and Faith. Our synod office is currently using it and we hope to start some small groups this fall. Each group can vary in size from 4-12 participants. This link will give you an overview of the program –

The way it is set up each group will meet once a month for discussion. We envision this starting in September and going through May. Meeting days, times, and location will be determined by each group. Each session requires about 90 minutes of viewing and 35 pages of reading to prepare. Those who have gone through this course have found it to be very valuable.

Our Youth

Pastor Josh and I are both committed to working with our youth. Pastor Josh hopes to find a day of the week and time when he can meet weekly for youth group activities. We will be working together with the Confirmation class to not only offer Bible studies and catechetical work but to help our youth get to know one another better through service projects, mission trips, and retreats.

Ellen Kennedy and I are working with our high school youth to help them develop leadership skills and to offer opportunities for service. It is another new group and very fluid. Based on the initial conversation we had with our young people this year we will have three emphases. We will look for opportunities to care for our environment. We will use the connections our young people already have with non-profit groups to volunteer our time. Youth will also take the lead in helping to plan and execute activities for the younger children.

Volunteers and Participants

This just gives you a small indication of the direction we are moving into for this fall. It does not include some of our ideas to help us reconnect with one another after more than two years of keeping a safe distance from one another. As our activities increase there will be an increased need for more participation and more volunteers. It is difficult sometimes to know how to jump in with all that we are doing at Redeemer so the Stewardship Ministry team will be writing a booklet this summer that will outline all of our needs and opportunities. It will be important on your part to review the materials we send out and prayerfully consider the areas of ministry where you can be of help and where you want to participate.

I am fully aware of all the demands that are placed on our time. Our young parents keep schedules that encourage children to be physically and mentally well while they also search for time to be together as family. Many of our adults already volunteer in different organizations in order to use their gifts effectively. At Redeemer we thankfully have a core group of people who volunteer. We want to enlarge that group so that everyone has the opportunity to serve. It also lessens the load for others. Stewardship of time is necessary for the church to maintain its mission and ministry. At Redeemer we love that our volunteers are among the very young and include those who are older. We encourage everyone to participate in the areas of ministry that will help them in their faith journey.

We need volunteers, participants, and . . . we also need your financial gifts. We are running at full capacity when it comes to our ministry staff. We are working within the boundaries of our current spending plan but that budget was set with the expectation that an equal amount of money will be received as income. Please give as you are able.

I am excited about the possibilities for our ministry together. For more than ten years now we have evolved and grown together. We continue to evaluate where we are and where we need to be to remain a relevant and vibrant church. Pray for us as we continue to plan for our future. Pray for guidance on where you see yourself fitting in. There is room for everyone at Redeemer.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JOSH

Dear Friends in Christ,

hope and pray that your summer is off to a great start. Pastor Sandy and I have been hard at work this summer planning the church year ahead, and one area that I personally have been focusing on is our youth group. Remembering from seminary lessons on the embedded cultures of a church, I want us to embark on a holy experiment of establishing the culture of a weekly youth group gathering here at Redeemer. In talking with colleagues in ministry, the youth, and parents, I would like to establish the culture of every Sunday night being known as our youth group time.

My vision is that we would meet every Sunday from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. from September to May. This designated time would be an opportunity for our two youth groups (middle school and high school) to gather for a meal, break off into their respective groups for a time of fellowship and learning, and then regather for closing worship. We would still have different events that we would participate in throughout the year as we have done in the past, but our focus going forward would be that of fellowship and faith formation.

If this holy experiment works, I see this method and style of youth ministry fostering a bond and relationship between our youth that will carry them not only through middle school and high school but college and their professional lives as well. Also, because of the weekly presence, it will be a place where our youth feel connected and safe to share the joys and trials of life together.

I am still in the early planning stages of this experiment, but one thing that I realize immediately is that I will not be able to do this alone. If you are someone who would be interested in helping to lead our youth group, please let me know. We will need leaders who are willing to help teach and facilitate discussions but also leaders to help with meal prep and closing worship (musicians!!).

One of the most important things I learned from the lessons on culture was that a cultural norm does not become "normal" unless the community embraces and supports it. Will you help us give this experiment a try and create a culture where our youth gather every Sunday without fail? Will you help us establish a safe place for our youth to walk their faith journeys with one another?

Together we can make this holy experiment a success!

I pray that you all have a blessed month ahead.

<u>Called to Order</u>: President Paukovits declared a quorum and called the meeting to order at 7:36 PM.

Approval of Minutes: Minutes from the meeting were previously approved by email.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Ed Regan presented the Treasurer's Report. Giving and use fees continue to exceed the expenses of Lutheran Church of the Redeemer. Indebtedness has been reduced to \$124,377.

Concerns about giving will be addressed in the June stewardship letter and in Pastor Kessinger's July Newsletter article.

Paster Wullenweber will look into providing QR codes for giving.

Building and Grounds:

Likely upcoming expenses:

Sprinkler piping/head in the nave leaked and caused damage to the sound board.

Repairs to the sprinkler system are needed and the sound board needs to be replaced.

Gym roof is still in need of repair and is being monitored.

Executive Committee: The Executive Committee met on May 27, 2022 to define discussion and action items for the full council. In addition we discussed:

Special Event Recaps

McLean Day: Roberta Pittman reported that McLean Day went well even though attendance was lower than anticipated. There was good volunteer participation for the event and many visitors to the booth. Tricia Engle will be responsible for McLean Day in 2023.

The Birthday Celebration of the Decades was very successful as previously reported by both pastors. Summer Bash was very successful as outlined in Pastor Wullenweber's report.

Redeemer Renaissance

Karen Miller reported that work is being done on the by-laws to allow the governing boards of the after-school program and the preschool to be combined.

Nate Paukovits reported that sub-groups of the combined board and roles are being clarified.

The owners of Spring Cleaning & Maintenance are retiring. Karen Detweiler moved that the retiring owners be given a letter from the Church Council as well as a \$250 gift card. Liz Holzapfel seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Columbarium Planning Update

Rob Wenk and Ron Kutscher joined the meeting at 8:30 PM. They have been working with Michael Foster to redesign the columbarium.

Stephanie Hunter reported that the refugee families supported by Redeemer are doing well.

Roberta Pittman reported that the Child Safety Committee is making headway bringing all approved adult volunteers into compliance with the Child Protection Policy.


