**A MESSAGE FROM
PASTOR SANDY KESSINGER**

**SEPTEMBER of 2024
CHURCH AND SOCIETY**

Luther was a strong believer that Christians stand under both government and church and have duties in both realms. One of the things that I appreciate about Redeemer is that our members are closely affiliated with what takes place in our government. Our people serve in a variety of roles and fulfill their responsibilities faithfully. For those of us not in government-related jobs, we live in Northern Virginia and our local news is really the national news. We are a well-informed congregation.

The church also offers us resources to study as we discern our role in society. We have both social statements and social messages that address some of the issues that we face in our culture. All offer Biblical foundations by which to start conversations. I am not a fan of picking the Bible apart by chapter and verse to answer or address all of our modern-day questions. However, we use Scripture to learn some of the overarching themes found in the Bible, such as our commitment to be faithful and obedient to God, and to love God and neighbor – and then to translate that into action.

DRAFT SOCIAL STATEMENT

The ELCA is currently drafting a new social statement titled "Civic Life and Faith." The draft is the result of three years of study. For those who are interested, we have until September 30, 2024, to read the draft and offer any suggestions. Once the task force that developed the statement receives everyone's comments, they will edit the draft based on the input from others. It will then be submitted for consideration at the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly. If adopted by a two-thirds majority, then the social statement becomes an official teaching of the church. It will serve as a discernment tool for us as we think about how our faith connects with our civic responsibilities.

STUDIES FOR CIVIC LIFE AND FAITH

A study was conducted that helped form the draft social statement that I just mentioned. The study was so well received that it remains a resource for those who want to learn more. The curriculum is divided into six

sessions. Each session has Bible readings, group discussion questions, videos, and case studies. Sessions can be studied in any order based on interest:

- How is God's Invitation to Discipleship Lived Out in a Democracy?
- How do Christians Address Controversial Civic Issues?
- What are Lutherans Views on Civic Life?
- What Are the Objectives of Democracy in the United States?
- What is Faith-Based Living Got to Do with Civic Life?
- How Do We Go in Peace to Love and Serve the Lord in Civic Life?

LUTHERANS IN AN ELECTION YEAR

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Capital Campaign Update

At the end of August, the total amount pledged or donated to the Capital Campaign is \$1,599,112 which is about \$5k higher than last month and represents 59.2% of our \$2.7 million goal.

Construction Project Updates from August

The blueprints for our interior renovations have been under review by the County since mid-May. We have just received the comments from those who reviewed the zoning, structural, electrical, plumbing, mechanical, and life safety aspects. There are 17 issues that need to be addressed by the architects and engineers. These responses will be in the form of additional drawings or written explanations to be submitted.

When the office space is remodeled on the education side of the building, a new office will be created for Linda McConnaughay, Executive Director over our Preschool, After-school and Summer Camp programs. Currently, Linda has to use a corner of a storeroom as an office. The new office will provide an appropriate space for the head of an important ministry of the church and she will be able to meet privately with parents, students, staff, and community members.

When the new Natural Play Area and the Columbarium construction is completed, the landscaping in these areas will be significantly enhanced. This new landscaping will require additional care for the new plants, bushes, and trees planted. We hope additional church members will assist those who already help care for the church grounds in this way. If not, we may need to engage a landscaping contractor to provide those needed services.

As you think about how you can support Redeemer's renovation and expansion plans, please consider one of the tax advantaged giving options. The gifting of appreciated stocks or mutual funds will help minimize capital gain taxes. Also, the gifting of retirement Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) can also lower your taxable income. - December 17th.

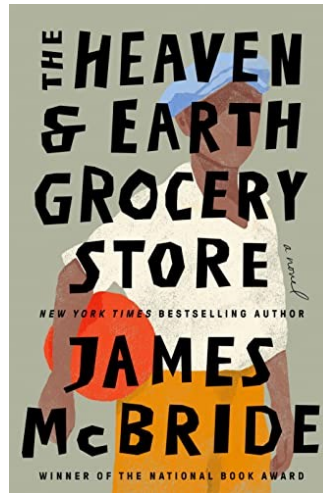
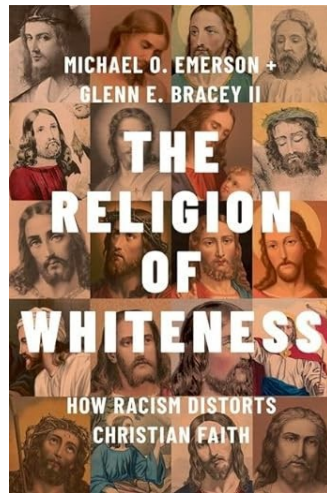

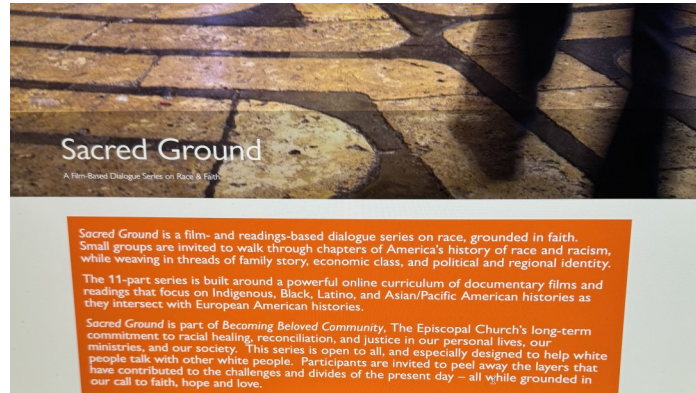
