MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KESSINGER

SEPTEMBER OF 2022

hen Jesus started his ministry he would invite others to join his mission with three words — Come and see.

As we enter the fall season I invite you to come and see what we are doing at Redeemer. Our plans are well underway that offer everyone opportunities to worship as the body of Christ, to grow deeper in our relationship with God through the study of Scripture, and to serve those in our community and abroad. The church does not exist without a mission and without the presence of its people. Come and see.

September alone is filled with some new things and some that are familiar. Although we have been highlighting these events in the announcements each week I wanted to reiterate our efforts to engage you in our mission and ministry. Almost all of the events have a fresh start. It is the perfect time to join.

Worship and Faith Formation

We have returned to three services – 8:30 am, 9:45 am, and 11 am. We livestream the first two services and then post the first service by 11 am if at all possible. Our Faith Formation, Confirmation, and High School classes resume on September 11 at 9:45 am. Table Talk, the adult class, will meet in the Conference Room at 9:45 am. Table Talk is hybrid so people can come in-person or attend via Zoom. On that same Sunday we will ask everyone who attends worship to help us pack the Baby Care kits, Health Care kits, and School kits for the ELCA Day of Service.

What is most exciting is all the other new things that will take place in September.

Women's Prayer Group - New

A new prayer group is starting on Tuesday, September 6, at 9:30 am. For our resource we will use a book by Eugene Peterson titled *A Long Obedience in the Same Direction*. With each chapter in the book we will incorporate Scripture to find concrete ways to live out our life in Christ. We will meet weekly and in-person at the church. Wednesday AM Bible Study – Renewed

On Wednesday, September 7, we will resume our morning Bible study at 8:00 am. The class is starting fresh with a study on the *Book of Daniel*. In order to accommodate those who attend from a distance this class will be held via Zoom. We will meet weekly. Sacred Ground – New Study Opportunity

On Saturday, September 10, we will meet at Redeemer from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm to start a series called *Sacred Ground*. It is a dialogue series that was developed by the Episcopal church. Small groups are invited to walk through chapters of America's history of race and racism. We will have lively discussions on how we came to have such divisions in our country and how to bridge the divide. Two groups have formed but we are open to more people joining us. The class will meet monthly through June of 2023. The first and last class will meet in-person at Redeemer. All the other classes will be held via Zoom at 7:00 pm, one on the second Monday of the month and the other on the second Tuesday of the month. I am so glad to be back from my summer tour and joining once again in the life and ministry of Redeemer. As summer winds down here at Church, our programming for the Fall months is beginning to pick up – this means that if we are getting busy, I know that our families' schedules are filling up as well. School activities, sports, dance, band, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, and the list goes on and on. With so much happening throughout the week, some of your responsibilities will inevitably bleed into the weekend and maybe even into Sunday morning.

So what do you do if you miss Sunday morning service? No one wants to wait until next week.....

Fear not! We have you covered.

I am excited to announce that we will offer a fourth service on Sunday evenings at 6:30 p.m. starting September 11th. We will gather in the sanctuary and end the night with a contemporary worship experience filled with praise and worship music, scripture, prayer, and Holy Communion. This will be a time to unwind from the busy week and spend just 30 minutes praising and worshiping God.

August Ham Report

On August 4, Ralph Dutrow delivered 11 boxes of ham weighing 385 pounds to Martha's Table from the Falls Church and Fairfax Honey Baked Ham stores.

On August 11, Roberta Pittman delivered 10 boxes of ham weighing 300 pounds to ThriveDC from the Falls Church and Fairfax stores.

On August 18, Rick Stewart delivered 3 boxes of ham weighing 105 pounds to Food for Others from the Fairfax store.

So for the month of August, we delivered 790 pounds of ham. A great month!

So far this year we have delivered 5,848 pounds of ham. A break down follows: Martha's Table, 2,320 pounds of ham; ThriveDC, 1,325 pounds of ham; So Others Might Eat, 1,015 pounds of ham; Rising Hope Church, 598 pounds of ham and Food for Others, 590 pounds of ham. All weights are approximate.

Many thanks to all of our Ham Heroes for their continuing efforts to fight hunger.
