Weekly Construction Project Update

The interior building renovations will be done in two phases. First, the old classroom side of the building will be renovated. Once completed and we are able to occupy those rooms again, the office side of the building will be closed and renovated. Doing it in two phases enables us to continue to use the sanctuary and allows us to maintain offices and staff on site during the construction. As areas and hallways are closed, signs will go up to direct members and visitors to any temporary offices and to the rest of the building.

Help Lutheran Social Services Help Refugees

Lutheran Social Services National Capital Area (LSSNCA) is one of the local agencies contracted by the federal government to provide services to refugees arriving legally, including Afghan Allies (those who assisted the U.S. mission in Afghanistan). The current federal grant funding has not been released and the \$2 million amount for services already provided has not yet been reimbursed. 42 staff members have been laid off and others have been furloughed.
