Upcoming Vote on New Construction Project At the upcoming Annual Meeting that will be held on Sunday, February 12, at 12 pm, voting members in attendance and via Zoom will be asked to vote on a proposed construction project that is estimated to cost \$2.7 million dollars. The project includes enhancing our outdoor classrooms and natural play areas, correcting site drainage issues, building a columbarium for the internment of a deceased person's ashes, renovating our original classrooms, offices and adjacent spaces, installing a new heating and cooling system in the original part of the building, and installing rooftop solar panels.
