Coming Forward for Holy Communion 8:30 am and 11 am

For Holy Communion you are invited to come forward (as you are comfortable) and kneel or stand by the altar rail. One of the pastors will offer you the host that will be dipped into the wine or grape juice based on your preference. Please receive it in your hands. For those who want to take Holy Communion that is preset, the acolyte will stand in the middle of the altar rails with a tray that has been prepared for you. The acolyte will also hold a basket for you to place the empty cup. If nobody signs up to be the acolyte one of the pastors will help you receive Holy Communion from the tray.

First Communion Class | Sunday, April 23

The next First Communion class will be held on Sunday, April 23, from 12:15 pm to 1:30 pm. If your child(ren) has shown an interest in receiving Holy Communion then please contact Pastor Kessinger. Those who attend the class will then receive their First Communion on Sunday, May 28, which is also Pentecost Sunday. If none of these dates fit your Schedules, then Pastor Kessinger will work with you to find an agreeable time for the class and/or First Communion.

Wednesday Evening Worship – March 22 6:30 pm (Dinner) and 7:30 pm (Worship)

During Lent the Wednesday worship experience will center on the "Five Gifts of Discipleship: How Do We Live Out Our Baptism?" Martin Luther taught that we are to daily renew our baptism. It is connected to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ and starts our spiritual journey. Through baptism we repent and receive forgiveness, love our neighbors, suffer for the sake of the gospel, and witness to Christ.

On March 22, we will explore the fourth of five spiritual gifts - "serve all people" following the example of Jesus. Luther Markwart will offer the reflection. We are using Holden Evening Prayer for our liturgy. Holy Communion will be offered each week. Please come for dinner that starts at 6:30 pm in Fellowship Hall and/or the service that starts at 7:30 pm in our worship space. All are welcome!

Ringing the Redeemer Group Dinner Bell For those at Redeemer with appetite for fun social gathering while dining, we look to re-start congregational "Dinner Group" events that had been on the menu, so to speak, before the pandemic came along. The plan is to form groups of about eight, with each group arranging to meet up sporadically (roughly once every two months) for a breakfast, lunch or dinner, either in potluck style at a group member's home, or at a local eatery where everyone in the group pays their own tab. All Wednesday evenings in March 7:30 pm	Wednesday Lenten Service and Dinner Worship with Redeemer for Holden Evening Prayer held every Wednesday at 7:30 pm until Holy Week. A supper will be offered at 6:30 pm.	
April 6 Thursday 7:30 pm	Maundy Thursday Join us as we remember Jesus' final hours with his disciples. We will reflect on the Last Supper and the gift of Jesus washing the disciple's feet. Since some are not comfortable with the washing of feet, we will offer the washing and blessing of hands – anointing them for service to God and all God's people. At the conclusion of this service we will strip the altar and pulpit as we prepare to remember the darkest days of Jesus' journey on this earth.	
April 7 Friday Noon	Good Friday Noon Worship At this most somber of services we recall Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion. On this day we will offer two opportunities to worship. At noon we will celebrate a more traditional service where we reflect on the readings and hymns of the day and conclude with communion from preconsecrated elements.	
April 7 Friday 7:30 pm	Good Friday Tenebrae Service In this most moving of services that elicits one's senses we will walk with Jesus on his final steps to the cross and watch as our surrounding grow ever darker with each step. Then as the tomb is slammed shut, we depart with our hearts heavy but still hopeful for the days to come.	
April 8 Saturday 7:30 pm	Easter Vigil Join us as we go from the darkness of the tomb to the eternal light of Christ's resurrection. In this most sacred of services, we gather in the dark of night and experience the promise of the resurrection. From darkness we walk with the first disciples as the tombstone is rolled away and the light of Christ is forever known by all God's people. We will watch and experience the change of our surroundings as we gather outside and slowly make our way to the sanctuary where in one triumphant moment we will sing Alleluia and celebrate Christ's eternal reign. Join us for this most ancient of liturgies.	
April 9, Sunday 8:30, 9:45 and 11	Easter Morning Services Christ is Risen – He has Risen Indeed! Join us Easter morning as we celebrate our Risen Lord and proclaim Alleluia forevermore. On this most special of mornings our worship will be enhanced by the beauty of flowers, the singing of our choir, and the accompaniment of a brass quartet.
